My dearest Brother:

God be thanked we are  
now all once more together in the  
Robin Nest and in good health and  
shirts.

Our voyage across the Lakes  
was boisterous and long: but God  
preserved dear Laura and myself  
and all on board in safety, thro' Jesus  
Christ. and we have much cause  
for gratitude -

I said we were all together in the  
Nest. but one bird is wanting - he is  
gone to Sturbeeville Ohio to get him-  
self a mate: and we are happy to  
add that we hear by yesterday's mail that  
he has succeeded. - He was married about  
the 20<sup>th</sup> of Oct. and will soon be with us  
- both himself and his bride.

I have time to say no more now  
but that I am always your loving brother P. Chase
