Your Cousin Mary O. Chase of

Sturbridge writes me that she fears from

thus fulfilled I have a little room & a

I was. - So much have I recovered that I

Uncle Dudley on another tour to the South  
west. - He shall be absent two or three sun-  
days, and then return to see to the many duties  
at home.

My time is so limited that I have  
room only to best be remembered to all who think  
of your aged Grandfather.
