New York 22 Bond St  
 July 10 - 1844

My dear Mother

Last night I arrived in  
 this City in good health. To day I shall  
 read my letters, <sup>with</sup> at Mr DePuyters Count  
 ing-house.

I shall stay in N. York for  
 nabe a fortnight or three weeks to get  
 some printing done; after which I shall  
 go to Boston and thence to see my  
 dear friends in Vermont

I left my dear daughter  
 at Kingston with her aunts and cousin  
 in that place. She will join me in my  
 visit to Vermont.

My spirits are good  
 - having preached almost every day since  
 I came from home; all this by the  
 grace of God given unto me thro'  
 Jesus Christ our Lord. With love to all  
 I am yr affectionate & grateful Mother
