Rev. g dear brother,

I arrived here a few days ago (on the 16th and now summon you to be & appear have also in your propa person as soon as possible after receiving this letter. I can afair you of a cordial welcome of as much enjoyment as is to be found in a beautiful valley g in intercourse with a Rind people. To speak derively, we do certainly expect you here and are not willing to be put off. You can come from Baltimore either by way of Philad" and Mauch Chink or by way of York & Hanisburg. There is a Railroad from Baltimore to York by which traveles leave Baltimore at go'clock A. m. & proceed from Vork to Hanisburg by Stage & Thence by canals. If you come by Philad? The route is by the Pottsville & Reading Rail Road to Port Clinton to Manch Chunk & so to Wilkestrane by canal on The Lehigh & Raic Road.
