Gentlemen

The R. T. Hon.

Lord Maynor in his Letter to me of the 17th  
of July received yesterday explaining and  
clearing away the mistake by which I supposed  
his Lordship took sent his late donation of £200  
sterling, & which I accordingly returned to you  
to be transmitted to his excellency in the Bank of  
Adam Tholpyn Esq of Liverpool, England -  
His Lordship's words in the letter above  
referred to are the following "I must beg you  
therefore to send your order for its transmis-  
sion to good Adam Tholpyn or I shall have to  
charge him to remit it to you"

Gentlemen if the above quotation  
of his Lordship's words be satisfactory to you  
I enclose, in your name not already sent the  
money to the said Adam Tholpyn Esq. that  
you would be so good to send the avails of the offering  
of £200 sterling the gift of Lord Maynor to  
me in the North River Bank of New York  
to my credit & their Receipt for the same will be  
satisfactory to, Gentlemen, your Faithful Friend & servt. J. P. Tholpyn
