I am sorry I have not been able to do anything for you the past year, but we have been in such a state with the Irish; Rail Road speculations, ^{school & church schemes} the monetary panic & the last 3 months prevailing disease I could do nothing. But I shall not forget you if things mend. Mr Wright desired me to say if you will subscribe to his project he will to your institution & the reciprocation may serve both.
