The school occupies almost all my timeyel & preach in the morning & have Sunday Dehood in the afternoon. The services are better attended, there where & least wrote The \$ 15,00 that you pain me

in Oct was the last money that I have reed from any source (reept a marriage for that I sent to my wife to bear her expenses here) of this fifteen dollars, Dix use spent in the recent of my trunk that was taken from white coming here = So V arrever here & have centimed, almost penaless = I shall set nothing from my school till after three menths = + the your have paid me more than my due yet if you could spare me fine dollars, (for a few little debts hose) I think I shall be able to maintain my credit.
