I am directed by the Lord
Kenyon to ask you the kind favour

Miss Bankers of Liverpool as it
is for a orphan Family of Children
who have lost their Father & Mother
who Emigrated in 1749 to that
country and the Bishop as shown
them great sympathy since their arrival
there and says that they are in
great want and the money is
from a friendly Society that is
coming to the dear orphan's
who are ten in number and I
do not know the exact sum that
will be paid by the society at present
but I will write and let you know
the exact sum as soon has I can

in possession of the Amount
