New York 27 March 1850.

here: or you may draw on us for the amount,
and call pay it over here to any person,
whom you may appoint to receive it & to
give us a receipt on your behalf.

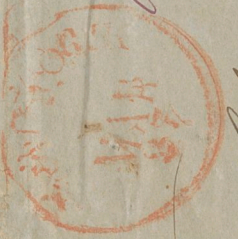

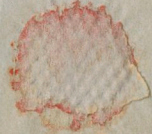
