Dear Niece

My dear wife and myself were made quite happy by the rec^d of your kind letter written at Mr Grant's in the presence of my only remaining Sister; who I rejoice to hear is again able to visit Connecticut. — May the good God continue to bless her and you and dear Alice with many an interview of this nature for Christ sake.

We were several weeks in coming hither having to stop on the way to fulfill some precious appointments in Madison, Randolph, and Union Counties in Illinois. On the steamer also I had to preach often and baptize several.

Since here the spinning of the Gen^l Conven^t has occupied all my attention and time; but nothing has yet been done of a decided character.

My own health, I think, on the whole is
better than it was last season although my
back is extremely weak and my catarrh
complaint very troublesome.
