Very dear Sir,

I received, this day, assurances
from the Synod of the Convention of the Dio-
cese of New York, that their Provisional

ported) his appointment.

in mail.

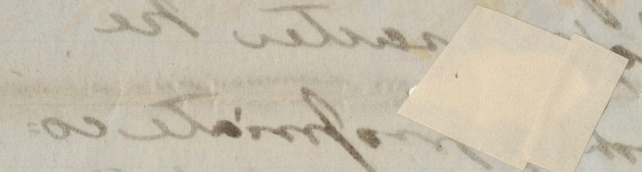
