and work harder for the benefit of the Depart-
ment than I am paid for, I shall no fault to

I am hard at work in preparing
matter for another motto. Embraing, as it well, all
things which relate to Jubilee College worth no-
ticing, I shall not trouble you ^{with} any remarks on

the school. The students are now more numerous
than ever ~~at the same time~~ and two more will
be here in a few days. ~~to their letters say~~

We are all well except your grandmother & she is
fast recovering from a short illness and with all on the
