I thank you for your apurances Christian friendship and affection. Jeterday had the melancholy Latisfaction paying a public tribute of respect and fection to the memory of your lamented father, peaching all day from 94m. 5:24. and Enoch walked with God; and he was not: for God took him. My coughe. gation, were large, and the people seem ed deeply interested in the considerations trought before their. I quoted from your ther to Dr. butler with reference to the East moments of the good man. I closed ith these words: He was a true Christian, Lound Churchman, a faithful deshop; and I can only add that I were to suggest an inscription for the monument that shall mark

the place of his rest, amid the quiet thades of his own loved Jubile it would be simply this: Philander Chase, Born December 14, 1775, Died September 20, 1852; His office, a Bishoprick, His Character, Fidelity, His Reward, a brown of Life. This Lad went is almost constantly in my mind. I feel that I have lost a time friend, and that the Church is deprived of one of its thougest pillars. But he has gone in God's own tune, and that is always the best time. You must undeed have deeply regretted your absence from the death-bed, & the funeral Leave; but their God does all things well; and blefsed he

his name! He can say of the venerable Lowant of God, well done! Rest from thy loved Employ; The battle fought, the victory won, Enter they master's joy. The pains of death are past, Labor and Lorrow cease; and life's long warfare closed at last, His Loul is found in peace. Toldier of bloust, well done! Praise be thy new Employ; und while Eternal ages um Rest in thy Lavious's jay." I hardly know why I write you again so soon, but I must give utterance to the motions of a full heart. Many God bless the application to the hole Church! I am glad to hear what Tour day of trother Reighly. I directly Rope he may be secured for Julilee.
