The writer, born and raised in Wisconsin, holds an M.A. and a Ph.D. degree in English literature from the Catholic University of America, Washington, D.C., was instructor or professor of English at several colleges, including the Catholic University, the University of Scranton, LaSalle College. He has written hundreds of articles and reviews, and eight books, and has published many pamphlets.

In 1939 he was awarded the University of Scranton Faculty Gold Medal as "outstanding educator of men." In 1940-41 he was president of the Debating Association of Pennsylvania Colleges. In 1941 he was co-founder of the review magazine *Best Sellers*.

For ten years he was chairman of the Pastorius Unit of the Steuben Society, Philadelphia; for six years national president of the Federation of American Citizens of German Descent, of which he is still honorary president. For several years he was on the speaker's bureau of the John Birch Society. He is an honorary member of the German-American National Congress. For several years he was chairman of the Greater Philadelphia Captive Nations Committee. He considers the liberation of these nations, including the Soviet Zone of Germany, and the dissolution of the Soviet Russian colonialism the only hope for preventing World War III.
