It is currently raining, but I will try to set up my excavation units so that if it stops, we can start excavating straight away.

I am working at the Northern edge of the Las Canoas site. I will be excavating a possible wall between two low lying structures on the edge of a slope.

I will start with a small axial (FH) across the feature and then follow it out.

The feature is oriented to 54° , so FH will cut across it perpendicularly at 144° .

I forgot to ask the Str. number so I will put it in my notes when I find out.

10 - March - 2004

Finished setting up 2 EUs of FH. Structure not yet rapped, so it has no number.

Have cleared surface, starting work @ 8:15. Fog on the mountains, but hopefully it won't rain again.

Will excavate both units at once.

Soil: Top soil is fine, dark rich brown

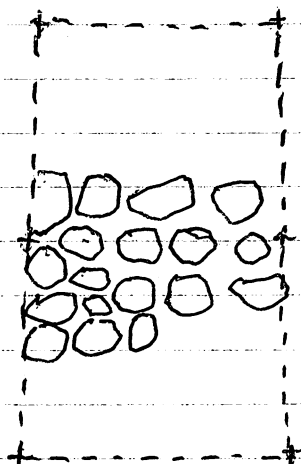
Inclusions: Some sub angular stones $\approx 2\%$

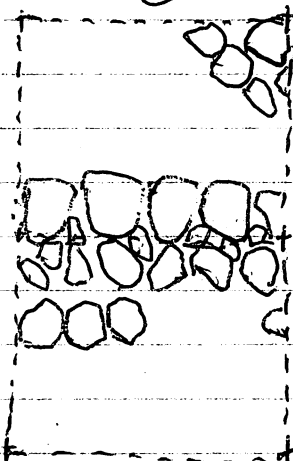

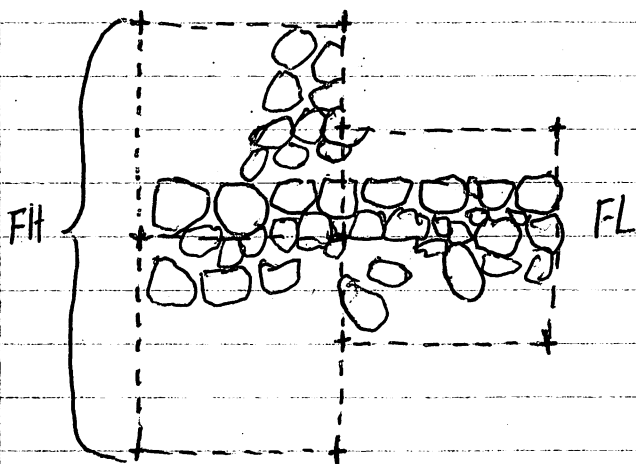

Started work at 8am. Fog in the valley, and cloudy sky but it will probably burn off pretty soon.

There was a dead cow on the way to the site (#186), hopefully it won't turn up in a trench later in the week.

Starting work by cleaning up FL/001. I have tried to explain to the workers not to stab into the ground with the trowel, but to scrape. The worst offender has chosen to ignore my sage advice and continues to hack away. Have tried again to explain that he might break the trowel, since telling him that he was just breaking sherds didn't seem to work.

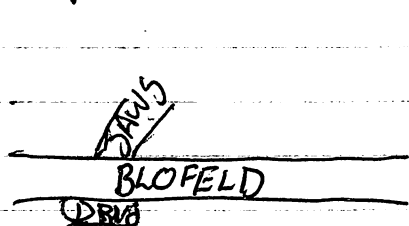

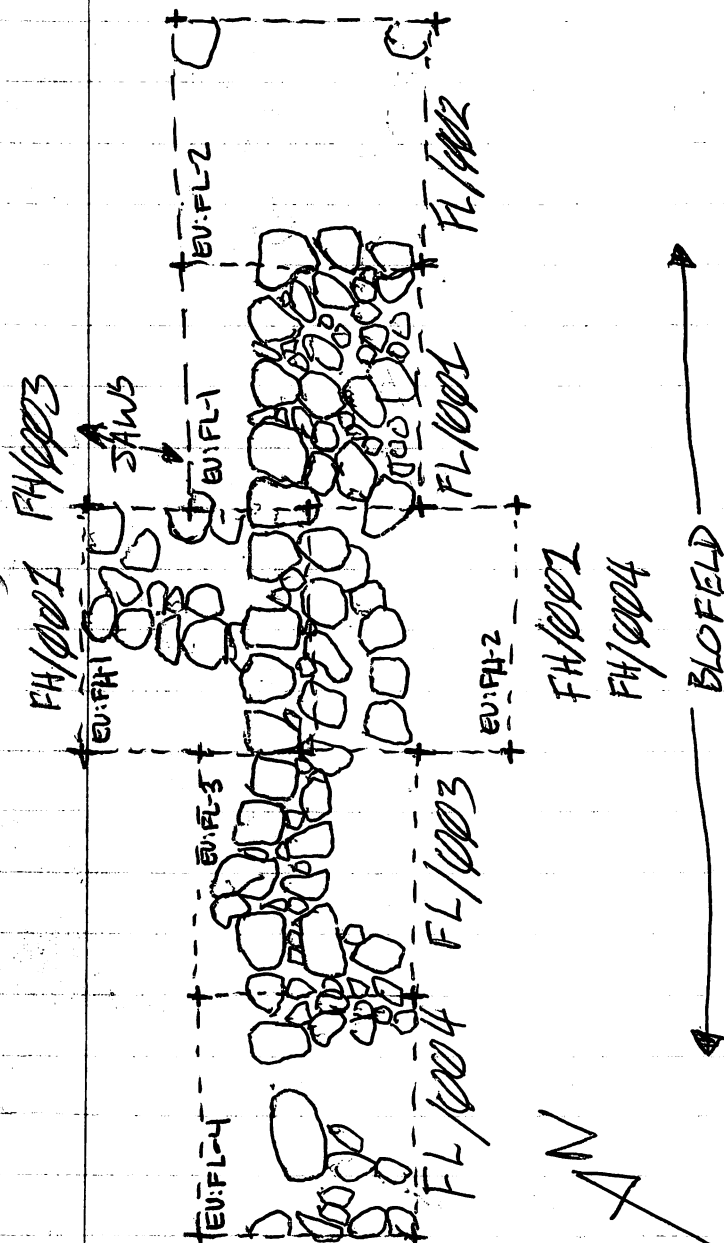

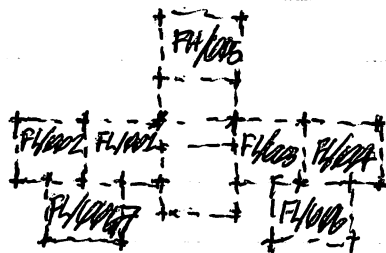

BLOFELD: runs roughly East-West. It is roughly ~~2~~ 4m long, one course high, and varies between 2 & 3 courses thick. It faces roughly North, and is made up of a combination of rounded and shaped cobbles (mainly basalt, but some lime stone).

BLOFELD has a corner cut at its Western limit with Spectre and at its Eastern limit with GOLDFINGER. JAWS runs underneath BLOFELD at roughly the midpoint of its length. DR. NO may be the Southern end of JAWS or it may run parallel to BLOFELD at a greater depth.

GOLDFINGER: runs roughly North-South meeting BLOFELD at its Eastern end. 1 course high and at least 2 thick. Same composition as BLOFELD.

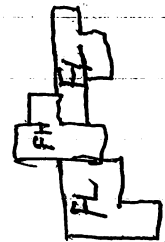
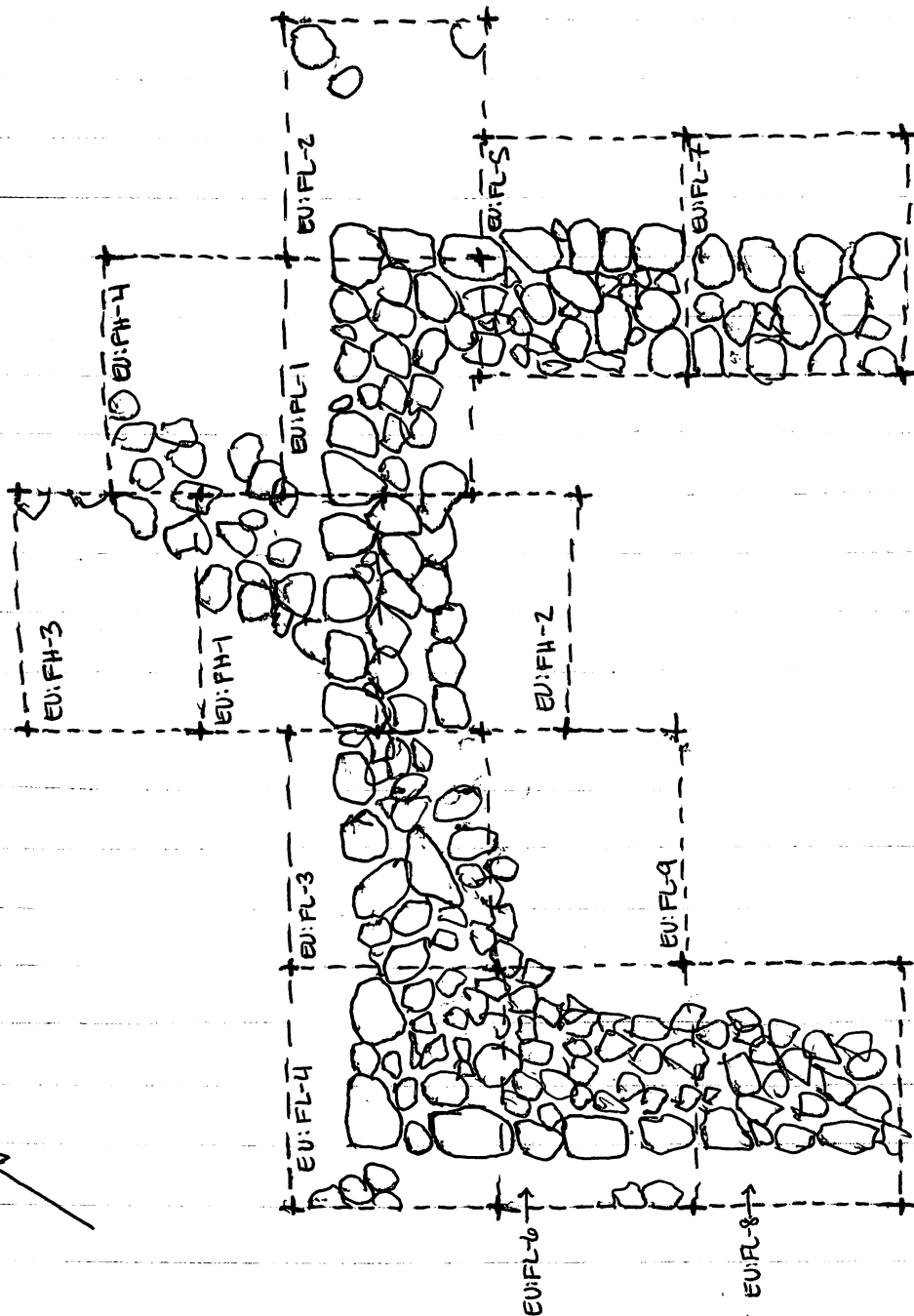
SPECTRE: runs roughly North-South meeting BLOFELD at its Western end. Similar composition, but also some larger boulders.

DR. NO: is only 2 stones long running East-West. There is \approx 10cm of soil between it and BLOFELD, which runs above it.

JAWS: runs roughly NW-SE, it is not as tightly built as the other features and has more irregularly shaped pebbles & boulders. It runs under BLOFELD, with ~~approx~~ 5-10cm of soil & shreds separating them.
