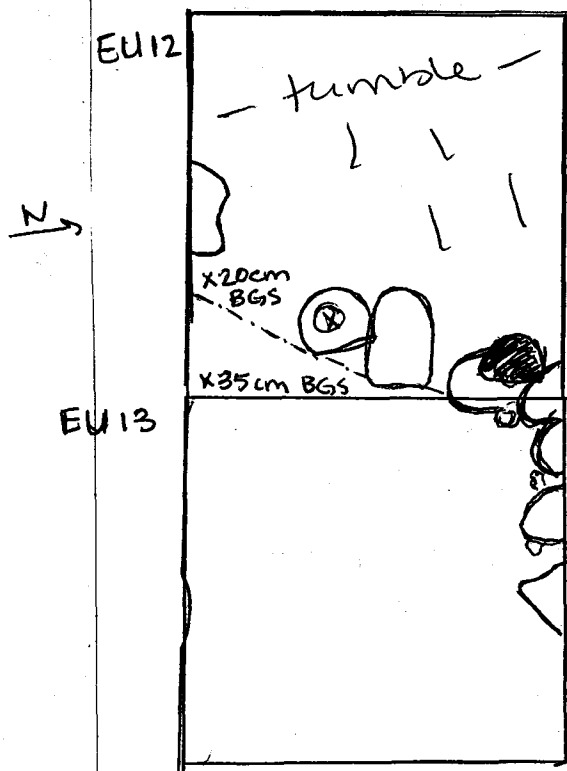

They cleared the triangle of dirt in the SE corner of EU 12 & did not reveal a second course of stones. I removed the rock marked X in the drawing & am clearing back into the tumble. I am labeling all of this lot 607E/012 from ground surface to 35 cm because the majority of the first 20 cm was tumble & yielded very few artifacts. The last 15 cm was mostly w/in the hard red clay which ~~also~~ is sterile.

Construction unit 1, ELBA, was 270 cm long 25 cm wide & 88 cm high. It was oriented exactly N→S & consisted of 8 courses of river cobbles ~~and~~ alternating w/ courses of chinking stones for 8 courses. The average rock size of ELBA was 20 x 20 cm, though it had rocks from 31 x 13 cm to 3 x 3 cm. Only 2 teeth still in alveolar bone. From visible section of L mandible, molars appear to have been lost awhile before death. Though upper 3rd & lower premolar don't show too much wear.

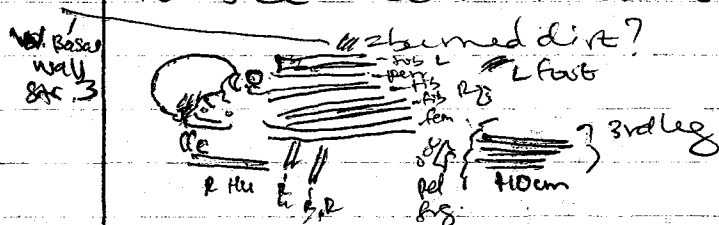

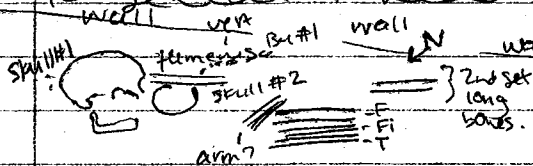
