Today is our first day in the field. I am working at PVN 598 expanding on excavations that began here in the spring of 2004 (by Charlie Webber and myself). 598 appears to consist of 18 structures, though apparent looting and large tree growth will prevent sampling several of the structures from the center and eastern portions of the site. Marcela is helping me get started today. It rained last night, and the ground is damp, but not muddy. I think we are going to begin by focusing excavations on structures 6 & 7, located on the south-eastern portion of the site (closest to the river). Structures 6 and 7 appear roughly comparable in size to structures 1 & 2 (excavated in the previous field season).

Structure 6

Based on lines of rocks visible on the surface, structure 6 appears to be approximately 8m x 6m rising 1 to 2 m above modern ground surface. I anticipate this structure to be more complicated than a simple rectangular platform, as its (approximately) northern end appears narrower than the southern end, and the northern end may have a later rock addition (that perhaps connects it to structure 5?). Structure 6 appears to be oriented at 338/158° along its longer side.

Wall-by-wall descriptions for sub structure 6

Sub structure 6 appears to have been erected in one or two phases of construction. The platform, 3.85 m x 3.76 m, is oriented 100/358° along its longer side. The eastern side is up slope and faces structure 6. The structure is taller (more courses) on that side than the other. The platform is divided on its summit by a N/S running construction unit

CAT

This construction unit was fully exposed, revealing a 4.25 m long wall faced on both the interior and the exterior of the structure. Larger rocks are used on the exterior than on the interior. Nearly all the rocks are cobbles, which makes sense given the proximity to the river. CAT is 1 to 2 courses high. CAT interdigitates with WHALE & EISA

STEP

A series of 4, flatly laid stones 17 cm from the eastern face of CAT. STEP's northern edge is 60 cm south of the corner of CAT. I presume that STEP served as a small step up onto sub structure 6, or as a small bench or work space in front of it.

WHALE

This construction unit was fully revealed in its length, extending from CAT to BIRD for a total length of 3.76 m. WHALE demonstrates the structure's sloped surface: to the west it is 7 course tall, while to the east it is just 4. The shift is most apparent, east of the eastern face of DOG.

Construction unit FISH comprises the southern basal wall of ^{sub}structure 6. This wider wall may possess the height and courses of WHALE or BIRD, but in the eastern portion, where we exposed fish to its base it just got wider suggesting a slightly stepped terrace along this side. FISH is comprised of a variety of types of rocks, including tuff, limestone, and basalt, and all exposed rocks are medium to large. It is not clear whether FISH interdigitates with or is abutted by DOG, but my guess

Substructure 6 is a small platform in the plaza space of ~~ANSA~~ raised in 1 or 2 phases of construction.

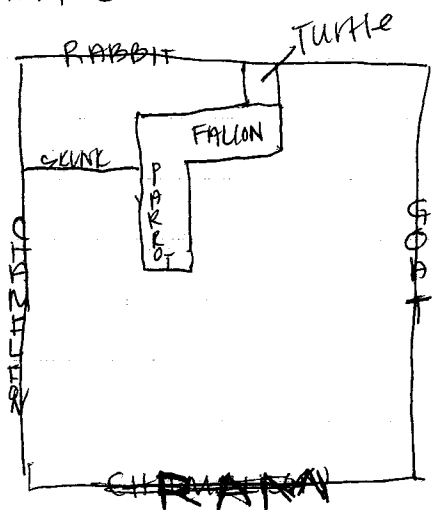

We did not expose RABBIT'S full height due to time & space constraints. RABBIT is abutted by TURTLE, a later, 1 course summit feature connecting FALCON to RABBIT. Interestingly, RABBIT'S northern (exterior) face is oriented differently (at 82/262° like HORSE)

FALCON

Probably part of an earlier construction that pre-dates Str. 6 as it is today. FALCON is currently revealed as a 1.13m long, 248/68° oriented part of an L shaped bench (probably the short-leg). FALCON is abutted by TURTLE and SKUNK, and interdigitates with PARROT. We probably do not have the true depth of FALCON.

PARROT

PARROT adjoins (interdigitates) with FALCON to form what was probably used as an L-shaped bench. The true length of PARROT is unknown, but its lower courses extend at least 2.10m from FALCON. PARROT does not abut RAM. Upper PARROT is 1.20m in length (this represents the part probably used as ~~the~~ Str. 6 summit architecture). PARROT is neatly faced both to the east and west, but with larger flat surfaces to the west.

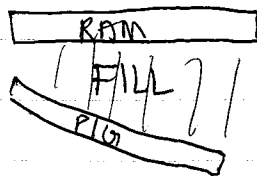

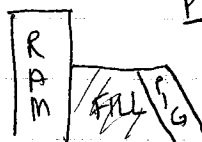

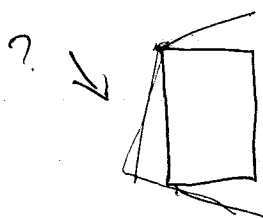

They are not re-orienting the structure, they're reshaping it, which is unusual to me. And would these additions have provided

extra work space? I am not entirely sure. Any BADGER is stones on end set on top of smaller stones, and then backed by fill all the way to CHAMELEON.

HORSE

HORSE, while apparently serving a similar purpose as BADGER and PIG is constructed differently. HORSE is constructed more traditionally with flat stones laid on their long, flat sides (normal). HORSE appears to be at least two rows wide, and also is angled so as to broaden the western side of the ~~the~~ structure that faces the plaza.

Neither HORSE, BADGER, nor PIG was followed outside of the axial trenches, so I do not know exactly how they corner, how long they are or any thing like that.

PONY

Oriented similarly to PIG, PONY was discovered at the

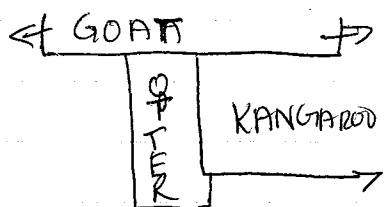

Near SKUNK, on summit: 40cm Below the surface of SKUNK, on the western profile of 598AI/EU2 is a 10-20cm thick clay layer. This layer extends to PARROT, where we also excavated. I defined this originally as fill, but the clay may have been deposited more intentionally.

Structure 7, final notes

Structure 7 is a much more complicated structure than structure 6, made even more so (for me) by the fact that I am less familiar with it. On the surface we anticipated certain unusual features... when standing in the plaza and facing south a slight dip with no rock.

Structure 7 is NOT comprised of 4 basal walls that support a single summit. At one time, this may have been the case, but structure 7 underwent many modifications over time. It is unclear to me what part represents the earliest phase of construction, but my guess is that a basal platform was raised, possibly comprised of TACOMA/TUNDRA, MINI/BEEBLE, JETTA or PASSAT and PINTO... actually maybe it will be easier for me to wrap my head around this structure if I just describe it as it is now, and then describe each wall, and then maybe the construction history will be more clear.

Str. ~~7~~ is formally faced to the north, towards the site's shared patio space. This formal entryway is defined by a paved floor and ^{raised} stone filled spaces to the east and west. These maybe walls, maybe rooms, there is a step (SATURN) added to the front of an older wall (OUTBACK) and then a prepared clay surface extends south to VOLVO a bench that may run the full length of the summit space on structure 6. The rock and raised rock blocks that define the entryway are later, and sit on top previous construction units.

~~Str. 7~~: Attached to the east of the raised platform, is what appears to be a surface level room.

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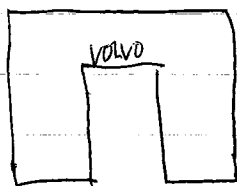

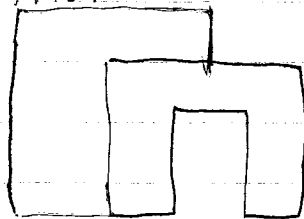
TACOMA/TUNDRA

In its present form, TACOMA|TUNDRA (front and back of same wall) is clearly defined for 4.50m, extending from 23cm into the formal entryway to its eastern terminus where it appears to corner with BEETLE/MINI (interdigitate). However, we assume that it once extended the full 7.50m across the northern face of the structure. Or maybe not upon closer inspection, the space between DURANGO and PENGOT is constructed differently than the space to the east. Maybe an early version looks like this?

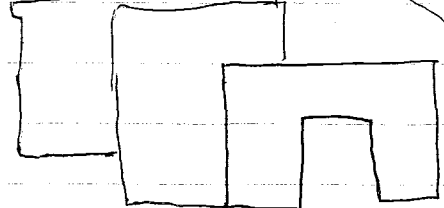

OUTBACK

I believe OUTBACK forms part of the original basal wall of Structure 7, and underwent several phases of construction & modification during its use history. Originally, I think it extended from WRANGIER to ~~PINTO~~^{AZTEC}, extending ~~5.0m~~ in length and oriented at 84°.

We exposed its interdigitation with WRANGIER and assume the same with ~~PINTO~~^{AZTEC}. OUTBACK is abutted by OUTBACK2, extending 1.50m east of OUTBACK (just an extension of OUTBACK). OUTBACK is abutted by SATURN a wall built parallel to OUTBACK. OUTBACK is abutted by ROCK BLOCK 1, made up of DURANGO, CELICA and PEUGOT. Later constructions prevented us from exposing OUTBACK's full depth.

WRANGIER

Extends from PASSAT to OUTBACK, and forms part of the eastern basal wall on the original basal platform.

This wall is very pushed out, and its depth was never fully revealed because of other construction units.

3.10m in length, 344° ~~the~~ small, medium, and large rocks are used in the construction here.

SHANTY-TOWN

Forms the southern basal wall of Structure 8. It is approximately 5 courses of rocks tall, and is defined by both an interior and exterior ~~face~~ face. A combination of large and small rocks were used. 1 m revealed.

CHAMPA

Summit wall running . We exposed 1m. CHAMPA is ~~1.8m~~ 1.8m north of SHANTY TOWN. A heavy bajareque deposits on the summit. This wall is at least 2 courses and faced to the north. I really couldn't speculate on total length, but might guess that it ran the full length of the structure.

OTHER WALL

Northern summit wall, at least two courses. Oriented at 260° - Faced north. Passes beneath Box. The space formed by OTHER WALL & CHAMPA is 100cm wide, and was filled with large tumbled rock and bajareque.
