Finished laying out trench for Structure number 98 suboperation 19A around 9:40 AM. This is the northernmost structure in a line of structures and potential terraces. My trench is one meter wide and 8 meters long. It is oriented 230° (crosses structure 98 in South east and NW direction. I'll be starting at the ~~W~~^{end}. Visible tumble towards the top of the structure. There is a tree located just to the north of the structure. I'm working with Raphael and Luis. The purpose of the excavation is to reveal structure 98.

19A/001: This lot was excavated ~~0-20~~⁰⁻²⁰ cm BGS measured from the SE corner of excavation unit 1. The soil changes from dark brown to a crumbly white rock about six and a half inches from the top. There was no tumble. There is a deposit of ~~red~~ red clay like soil mixed in every so often. Within this lot a few pieces of ceramic was found as well as chert and black and green obsidian. I'm going to continue on for 10 more centimeters.

19A/002: This lot was excavated ~~from~~^{from} 10-20 cm BGS measured from the SE corner of excavation unit 1. The soil continues to be chalky and white in color. This is most likely a floor. There are no artifacts found but there are a few pieces of pigment rock mixed in with the crumbly white soil. This will be the last lot I excavate today and I will decide tomorrow how I want to proceed.

Today is Wednesday the sixth. It is about 7:30 AM and there are absolutely no clouds in the sky. I'm feeling a little tired but I'm quickly waking up. I am continuing on Lot 2 this morning by extending it another 5cm. The I am attempting to go down as deep as the floor goes. If 5cm doesn't reach that point I'll go down another 5cm to 30cm and then start a new lot. I'm working with Ray and Louie as well today.

19A/002: This lot continued from 10-25 cm. The chalky rock continued down the last 5cm. but it changes to become more dense after that which is why I have decided to change lots. There was absolutely nothing more found except for the few pieces of ~~fragment~~ pigment rock.

19A/003: This lot was excavated from 25cm to 30 cm. The soil continued to be chalky and filled with rock. Pat and Ed say to stop here and move on to the next excavation unit. The only thing found in this lot was one piece of pigment rock. I'm going to continue on to the next excavation unit and this time run my lot until the soil changes.

19A/004: This lot is one EU E of the W most end of this trench. This lot is excavated from 0-12 cm. The soil change is evident once again and I'm going to move on to the next excavation unit. There was

19A/005: This lot was excavated 0 - 10 cm BGS measured from the SE corner. The white rockish fill that I have been encountering was much closer to the surface, here. Within this unit I found chert, ~~obsidian~~,³ ceramics. There seem to be less artifacts the further I move up on my structure. This lot is located ~~30~~^{Unit} EU East from the western most ~~end~~ and I am going to continue upwards from here onto the next EU.

19A/006: This lot was excavated from 0 - ~~10~~²⁵ cm BGS measured from the SE corner. The whitish rock fill has been decided to be a floor. From here on out I will refer to it as JABBERWOCKY. There were a few bigger pieces of ceramic within this lot as well as a few pieces of chert and 1 piece of obsidian. This is within EU ~~45~~^{Unit} which is located ~~45~~^{Unit} EU from the western most ~~end~~. From here onto the final lot for today.

19A/007: I intend to excavate this lot until I start to see the construction JABBER WOCKY once more. I'll continue this lot tomorrow. Thus far I have found 4 pieces of ceramic that seem to make an ocarina as well as other ceramic pieces and a couple pieces of chert.

Today is Thursday the 7th of January. It is now about 7:10 AM and it is another clear day. I am continuing on with lot 007 this morning and I'm working with the same two men, Raphael and Luis. I plan on continuing to follow out the floor ~~JABBERWOCKY~~ JABBERWOCKY today and see where it leads.

19A/007 cont: I have finished excavating this lot. It extends B 05-13 cm BGS measured from the SE most end. This lot is within the 5th EV. There was much more pieces of ceramics within this lot than I've been finding previously. The pieces were also much larger than others that I've found. Again the floor JABBERWOCKY is easily found a few centimeters from surface level (about 6 cm). For the next lot I will move on by only scraping off the top soil.

19A/008: For this lot I excavated from 0-10 cm BGS from the SE corner and 0-4 cm BGS from the SW corner. I tried to only scrape off the top soil so that the floor JABBERWOCKY is easily visible. Within this lot there is a bit of rubble. There are three big rocks that look like they could be the start of another construction. I will have to investigate this further in the next lot. There were a few more tiny shards of ceramics and 1 piece of chert within lot 008. This lot is in the 6th EV from the western end. On to the next.

19A/009: This lot was excavated from about
Ø - 5cm BGS. There is no real point to measure
from because most of this lot is pure tumble. I
only removed the top soil to clean off the rocks
and get a better idea of how they lay. The
rocks range from about 30cm to 5cm. This
was within EU 7. There was 1 piece of chert
and 1 piece of ceramics within this lot.
I'm going to move west one to EU 6
and ~~see~~ dig down 10 cm to see the position
of a few of those rocks before I move on.

19A/010. This lot was excavated from 10-20cm
BGS measured from the SE end. This lot is within
EU 6 heading east from the western most end. The
tumble within this place looks fairly random but
as I dug down I found a lot more ceramic
shards and one piece of obsidian. I'm going
to move on to EU 7 and move back my lot 10cm
across and 10cm down to work my way across this
EU.

19A/011. This lot was excavated from 0-33cm
down and 44cm across from the western most
end. It is located in EU 7. Starting at 44cm
a ~~the~~ possible wall starts. There was a lot of tumble
before this that didn't have any determinable pattern.
There was a lot of ceramics in this lot as well as
chert and obsidian. I'm going to move on to EU 8
and approach this possible wall on the other side tomorrow.

It is now 7:26 AM on Friday the 8th of February.

It is kind of cloudy and overcast out here but it looks like the day will clear up. I am moving up to lot Ø12 in the 8th EU. Raphael and Louis are again working with me today. I'm going to scrape away the top soil and expose the rocks to see if the construction in EU 7 is a wall or if it is just tumble.

19A/Ø12: This lot was excavated from Ø-8cm BGS measured from the SE corner of EU 8. The topsoil was removed to reveal the rocks beneath. So far it looks like it could have been a construction but it was most likely destroyed. There were a few pieces of ceramic in this lot as well as chert and a piece of obsidian. I'm going to extend my trench 2 more metres and excavate those squares in the same manner to see if there's any sign of a construction.

19A/Ø13: This lot was excavated from Ø-~~8~~⁵cm BGS measured from the SE corner of EU 9. Again only the topsoil was removed to reveal the tumble. The size of the tumble layer from about 10cm to about ~~50cm~~ 40cm. There were a few ceramic pieces found as well as chert and obsidian but just like lot Ø12 there was very little of it. I'm going to move on to the next meter square.

19A/014: This lot was excavated only a few cm down. The purpose was to remove the topsoil and reveal the tumble underneath. This lot is within EU10. The tumble here ranges in size from about 10 cm to 50 cm. The tumble in this lot looks as if it is thinning out compared to the EU before it. It is slightly less dense but still pretty concentrated. I'm now going to move back to EU 7 and remove the rocks that look as if they have ~~been~~ been upset to see if there is a more definite construction underneath.

19A/015: I decided to move back ~~one~~ one more meter instead of going back to EU 7. I dug down 0-20 cm within EU11. The tumble drops off fairly quickly. There is what looks to be a back wall on the western end of the EU. This wall will be named ~~Barling~~ BRILLIG. Within this EU there was some chert, obsidian, and pottery shards but less than I've been finding elsewhere. I'm now going to move back to EU 7 to continue out my plan of removing some of the top rocks.

~~19A/016~~ 19A/016: This lot was excavated from 0-50 cm BG's measured from the SE point. It is 56 cm across starting from the middle of the EU back. This is within EU 7. There was a good bit of obsidian as well as 1 piece of chert and obsidian. Even though this is cutting into the tumble there are no discernable constructions. I'm going to continue on Monday by extending my trench ~~later~~ laterally to the North to hunt out any well lines.

Today is Monday the 11th of February. It is now 7:30 in the morning and very overcast and cool. I'm beginning this morning by extending lot 016 by removing one more rock to see if there is a possible construction underneath it. After that I plan to move out laterally starting at EU6 and extending out towards the North. I'm again working with Raphael and Boris.

1901016 cont: To finish up this lot I have removed one final rock that was standing right on the western border of EU8 and EU8 the eastern border of EU7. There were a few more ceramic shards found as well as a piece of chert. Since no wall or construction was apparent I decided to move back 45 cm into EU8 and remove several more rocks to hunt out what might have been an earlier wall. I dug down to a depth of about 35 cm. There are still a lot more pieces of ceramic but they are all buried underneath the fill. I'm now going to move out laterally to try and hunt out some kind of wall. After removing a few more rocks and looking at it more closely there does seem to be a wall in the middle of EU8 about 45 cm back. I have named this wall ~~SL~~ SLITHY. A matate was also found among the rocks that had been removed.

~~196/001: 196/001: 196/001:~~ 196/001: This lot was excavated from 0-27cm BGS measured from the SE end. It extends out from EU 6 and goes out 1 ~~EU~~^{meter} North. There are plenty of rocks within this EU on the E most side. It could be a possible wall but it's hard to tell from here. There was one piece of chert and ~~a lot of~~ some ceramics but not very many. All the ceramics came from the southern most edge. I'm going to move out one more unit and excavate that to see if these rocks actually form a construction of some kind.

196/002: This lot was excavated from 0-27cm BGS measured from the South East corner. This lot had only 2 pieces of chert within it and nothing more. There are rocks just on the Eastern most side that could be forming a possible wall. One rock seems to have been pushed out of place by a giant root from the nearby tree. This lot is in EU 2. I'm going to go East one more unit and follow the visible line of rocks.

196/003: This lot was excavated from 0-5cm BGS measured from the SE corner. This lot is within EU 3. There is what appears to be a corner where two walls meet within this unit. I'm going to follow this wall East into EU 4 before turning it. There was again very few artifacts within this lot, one piece each of obsidian, chert, and ceramic.

196/004: This lot was excavated from 0-5cm measured from the SE corner. I found several pieces of obsidian including a shaped arrowhead/blade. There are a few more rocks that look as if they form part of the wall that I've been seeing. I'm going to move back to EV3 and remove some rocks that look out of place before moving forward. Also in this lot was ceramics and chert.

196/005 This lot was excavated from 5-50 cm down and 0-48 cm from the W most end of EV3. I removed the rocks that looked as if they were tumble to reveal the more probable wall behind. It's still questionable but these rocks line up with those in EV7. Within this lot was some more ceramics, obsidian and chert but not many. I'm going to extend this subop one more unit.

196/006: This lot was excavated from 0-20 cm BGS from the SE end of EV5. The probable wall continues N. but I'm going to wait to name it until I go a little bit further north. Within this unit there was more obsidian than I've usually been finding as well as chert and ceramics. Tomorrow I will continue on North and follow this wall.

196/007. This lot was excavated from 0-16cm BGS measured from the SE corner. This lot is within EU 6. Within this lot there was a lot of ceramics, more obsidian than usual, and a bit of chert. 196/008: This lot was excavated from 0-16cm BGS measured from the SE corner within EU 7. Within this lot was an abundance of ceramics, chert, and obsidian. Instead of finding a corner though it looks as if there are actually two walls. I'm going to jump back to see if there is actually a line closer in leading to BRILLIG.

There is way too much fumble in this area however to make an accurate guess of the location of the walls. I'm going to move to the other side of my original trench and start a new sub op. I'm going to follow this out further away from the tree and its roots.

190/001: This lot was excavated from 0-20cm BGS measured from the SE corner of EU 1. Within this lot I found two green obsidian blade fragments, black obsidian, chert (green), and ceramics. There was no large fumble whatsoever within this lot. I'm going to move on to EU 2 to hunt out the wall that I saw in 196 EU 8. Within this lot as well was a very small piece of carbon. Too small to be useful.

Today is Tuesday the 19th of Feb. I'm beginning to excavate around 7:30 in the morning. The sky is overcast as it has been the last couple days. I haven't found any sure lines at all yet. I'm gonna keep on moving in hopes of finding out how this structure was laid out.

190/007: This lot was excavated from 0-20 cm BGS measured from the SE corner of EU 7. There are a few rocks laying around in this lot but they look as if they are simply tumble. On the North the other surface MOMERATH borders it. On the Northern side of MOMERATH there lays the surface BANDERSNATCH. This is the second structure in the first building period. MOMERATH on the South, BRILLIG on the West, TUMTUM on the North, and on the East the Southern side of TOVE and SLITHY. The second construction phase is that of MOMERATH. Smaller rocks and a slightly lower stance set this apart from the rest. The third construction phase is the surfaces TUGGY and CALOOL-CALAY. TUGGY is marked off by the ~~top~~ Northern part of TOVE in the East, and SNICKER-SNACK in the E, and BOROGROVE in the North. BOROGROVE in the North and TUM-TUM in the South mark off CALOOL-CALAY. These structures look as if they were extensions added later. Finally there is MANXOME which is like MOMERATH in the way it looks, however it seems to be completely unfinished.

Structure 68 was occupied over many years. There is evidence to suggest the first occupants lived here in the late classic and the last occupants in the early post classic. I have isolated about ~~five~~^{four} building phases.

To begin with I think the Northern line PRESENCE was built first to link this structure with the terraces and structures to the north. On top of PRESENCE they built the Northern basal wall TOREADOR which is met on the west by LASOMBRA. On the south end LASOMBRA corners with BLACK HAND and that in turn corners with INKONNU.

Above TOREADOR on the north side that faces towards the plaza a series of steps were built up the face of the structure. SABBAT comes first and is only 20cm long by 30cm wide and 21cm tall. Then comes INDEPENDENT which runs across the eastern side of the structure 420cm exposed. CAMRILLA is right above this but like SABBAT it is only 40cm long. All three are made out of cut stone blocks.

Above CAMRILLA and still within the first construction phase is SETITE. This wall runs across the ~~eastern~~^{northern} facing ~~of~~ of the building. I think that it corners with SAMEDI on the east.

This After ~~setite~~ SETITE comes a series of more steps very close together. RAVANOS comes first, followed by BAALI and finally ASSAMITE. ASSAMITE was poorly preserved but I think it stands the highest and is the Northern most wall to the summit.

This brings me to the summit. I only found two well preserved walls for the summit. The southern most wall is called SERPENTIS runs east to west 750cm and stone 47cm high. I think that it might meet up with SAMEDI on the east but I could find no cross wall. On the ~~western~~^{eastern} side SERPENTIS abuts against PRINCE. PRINCE seems to have been constructed earlier even though SERPENTIS lies lower. PRINCE continues southward past SERPENTIS. it too could possibly abut with BLACK HAND. The Summit seems to be one large room the western side of which is 455cm and the southern side is 750cm. On the ~~east~~^{west} of the summit there is a large bench. The surface DHAMPIR is constructed out of small rounded river cobble and limestone.

That is the first construction phase for this structure. The broad measurements are about 1200 cm on the N, 1120 on the East, 1100 on the South, and 1150 cm on the west.

The second construction phase comes in the form of an attachment on the western side of the building. The measurements of this little room are 230cm on the North, by 570 on the east and west, and 390 on the South. This LASOMBRA is used as the eastern wall in this construction. VENTRUE is the southern most wall and this abuts against LASOMBRA.

GIOVANNI runs Northward and is met by DAUGHTER OF CALOPHONY. Less than a meter south of DAUGHTER OF CALOPHONY is BLOOD BROTHERS. This wall was constructed before GIOVANNI because it runs under and westward past GIOVANNI. BLOOD BROTHERS most likely abutted against LASOMBRA but it wasn't well preserved enough to tell. The third phase of construction lies in another little area in the Southwest portion of this structure. Secondly the same thing was done in the area of the third construction phase. It seems like a platform type thing was constructed. This the edges of which are PRIMOGEN and DOMINATE on the east. TREMERE and MALKAUIAN on the west. AUSPEX heading east from MALKAUIAN on the north and then coming with OBFUSCATE to run north again. PRIMOGEN is most likely the back east end of OBFUSCATE. On the south SALUBRI runs east to DOMINATE. It also seems as if they were trying to relate this area to TZIMICE, by adding a little cross wall, CAITIFF, from TREMERE to TZIMICE.

The third little addition runs along the southern end of the structure. This is a large wall running 1020m long round GRANGREE. This wall has no clear defining features whatsoever. 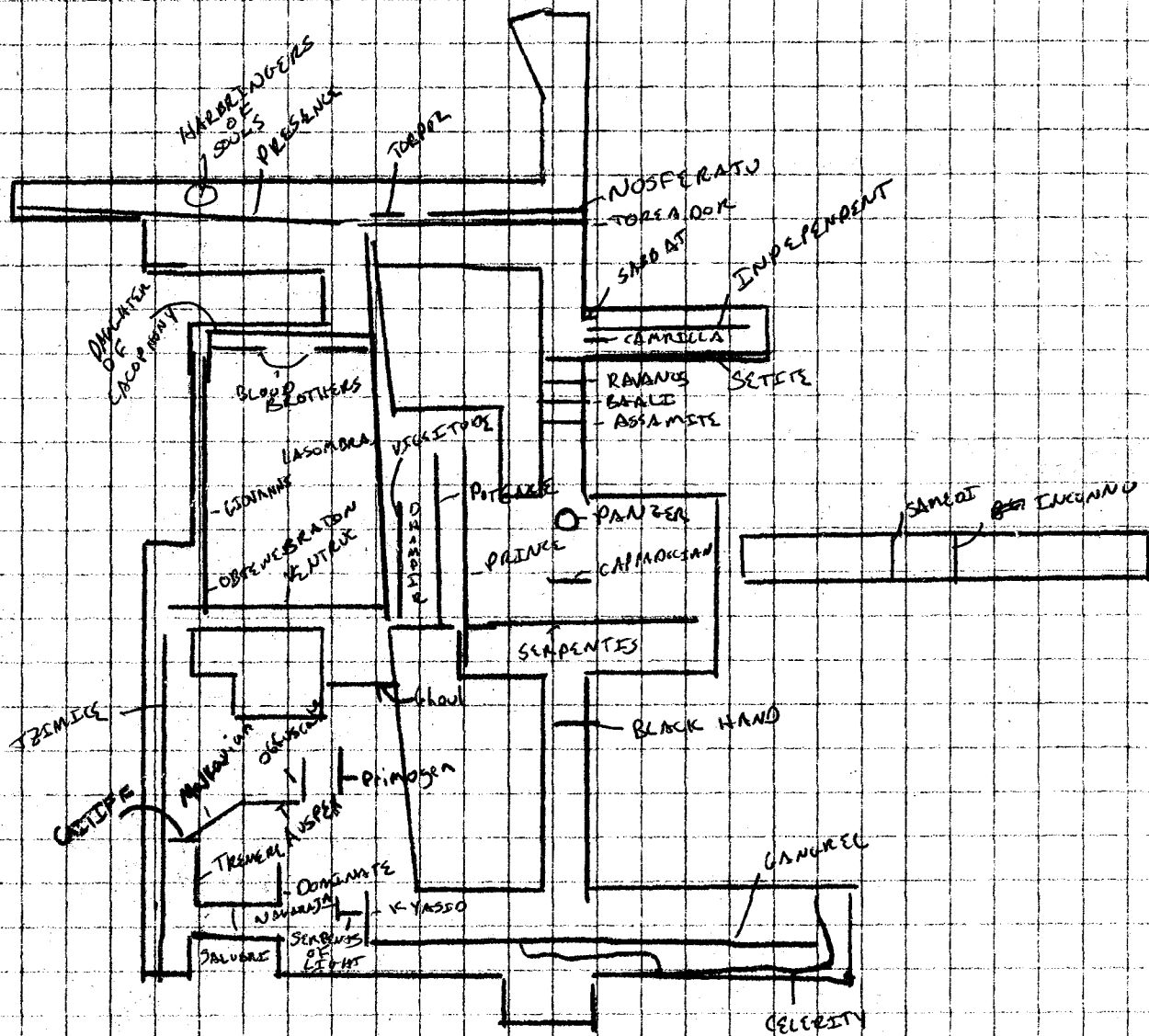

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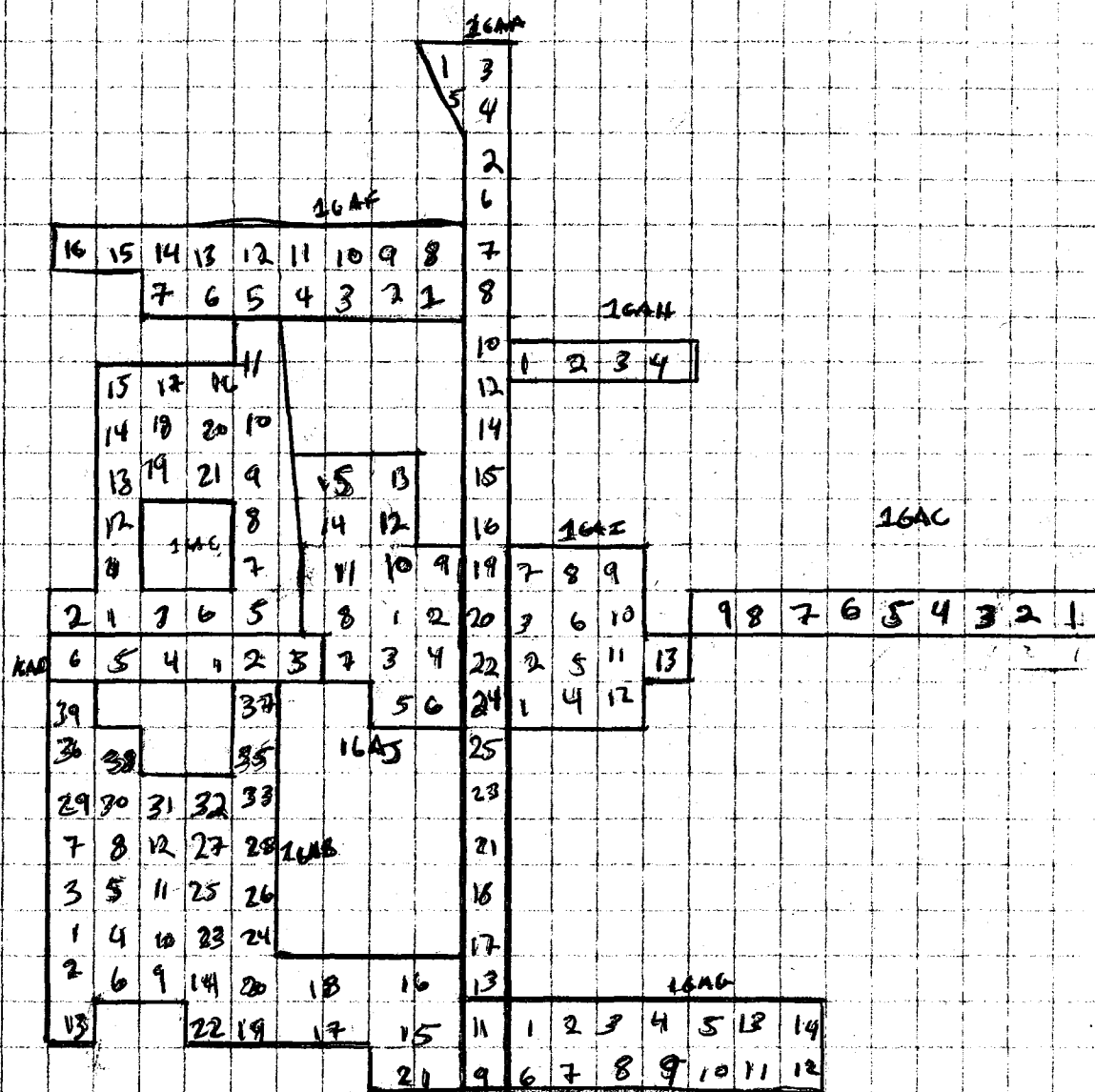
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El Coyote: Structure 68

Structure 68 was chosen for excavation because it seemed to be a representative of the furthest elite residential structures within El Coyote's Southwestern edge. Structure 68 is located 20 meters west of structure 77, 21 meters south of structure 70 and 12 meters south of structure 75. The Subop. for the axial trench was 16AA, which was 1 meter wide by 23 meters long. This trench was oriented 340° and cut across the center of this mound at its highest point. Architecture was followed out on this main trench in several different Sub operations. Subops. 16AF, AJ, and AB all head off of the main trench to the west as Subops. 16AH, AI, and AG all head off this axial trench to the east. Two other axial trenches were excavated on both the east and the west side of this structure. The axial trench located on the eastern side of the building, 16AC, is oriented 70°. This trench is 1 meter wide by 9 meters long and begins at the eastern base of structure 68. The axial trench on the western side of the building, 16AD is 1 meter wide by 6 meters long and is oriented 60°. Subop. 16AE heads off to the north from this western trench. In total 168m² were excavated with the maximum depth reached being one meter below modern ground level within Subop. 16AE. There seem to be four time spans associated with this structure ranging from the Late Classic to a transition time between the Late Classic and the Early Post Classic. Structure 68 was cleared by six men working under the direction of Anya Slaven from March 14, 2002 through May 13, 2002.

Time Span 1

About 15cm of S.2 underlies this structure. S. 2 a dark brown, hard, claylike soil with little white flecks in it. This level of soil seems to run under the Northern side of Structure 68. Above this level is the first bit of architecture that seems to have been placed here. Construction Unit 1 runs 6 meters at an orientation of 58°. It is composed of two courses of rounded limestone rock. CU 1 stands 8 cm high and it seems to run further to the west which might connect it to other structures nearby.

In front of CU 1 there is a surface construction, CU 3. CU 3 is a surface that is laid in front of CU 1. It is composed of mostly rounded river cobble and runs 110 cm long and

20 cm wide. Both CU 1 and CU 3 seem to be connected to another building that is further off to the west and both seem as if they were constructed before the rest of structure 68.

At the end of time span one a 6 meter long wall had been constructed in the northern front of the building and a small surface was placed in front of it.

Time Span 2

Structure 68's core is a large summit room the basal walls of which are down at the bottom of the mound with steps leading up to the top. Construction unit 4 is a 1-2 course high step that runs 440 cm at an orientation of 248° and stands only 47 cm tall. CU 4 is made of mostly rounded river cobble. To the west of CU4 is CU 2, which is a small construction that lies lower than CU4. CU 2 is composed of one course of rounded river cobble that stands 11cm high and runs about 60cm at an orientation of 250°. It is 40 cm wide and runs just in front of CU 5. CU 5 is the northern basal wall of structure 68. 500 cm of this wall was excavated at an alignment of 248°. This wall rose 32cm and its two courses are once more composed of mostly rounded river cobble. On the NE CU 13 corners with CU 5 which creates the eastern basal wall. Like CU 5 this construction is made of rounded river cobble. It was not too well preserved but it seems to stand 85cm high and have a width of 55cm. Only a meter of this construction unit was exposed with an orientation of 340°. The southern basal wall is CU 15 and like the others it was constructed with rounded river cobble. Once more only a meter of CU 15 was exposed. CU 15 has an orientation of 252° and it has a height of 91 cm. Finally the western basal wall is CU 16. 920cm of this wall was exposed at an orientation of 338°. This was one of the best preserved walls of the entire structure. It had anywhere from three to five courses and stood 145cm tall at its highest point. CU16 is 46cm wide and like the others also composed of mostly rounded river cobble.

Leading up to the summit from the northern end there is a series of steps, CU 6-12. CU's 6-8 are all made of cut stone limestone whereas CU's 9-12 are all made out of rounded limestone. These lead all the way up to the summit and once you reach the top you find a bajareque surface, CU 21. Behind this small surface there is a line that runs at orientation of 240°, which lines up with the orientation of CU's 6-12. This construction, CU 22, runs lower than the other construction units on the summit. This construction unit is 750 cm long, 33cm wide and 47cm high. It was constructed out of rounded river cobble and stands two courses tall. To the west of this is a large bench bordered on the east side by CU 23 and on the west by CU 17. CU 22 abuts CU 23 on the southern side. CU 23 is a one to two course wall made of rounded limestone that is oriented 330°. This construction is 455 cm long, 67 cm, and 54cm high. On the western side CU 17 was constructed with mostly cut stone blocks made out of limestone. This construction is 187cm long and 34cm high. It is oriented at 340° and is one to two courses high. There is a surface that runs along this bench. This construction is CU 18. This was constructed out of mostly smaller rounded limestone and basalt rocks. It runs for 181cm and is 18cm wide.

This time span like the last only contained the S. 2 soil just like time span 1. At the end of this time span the basal walls had been constructed. Stairs lead up from the northern part

of the building to the summit where a bench stretched out to the west. The summit too had finished construction. The western basal wall was built right next to CU 1 linking it to the rest of the building.

Time Span III

Within the third time span of this construction a smaller second room was added to the west of the summit building. The southern side is much better preserved than the northern side. On the southernmost edge CU 24 abuts against CU 16 and runs 390cm long at an orientation of 60°. CU 24 is 50cm wide and 58cm tall standing one to three courses high. This wall was constructed out of rounded river cobble. CU 24 interdigitates with CU 26 on the west. CU 26 is 39cm wide, 57cm tall, 570cm long, and is oriented at 150°. It is composed of three to four courses of rounded river cobble. Where CU 24 meets CU 26 there is a single cut stone step. This step, CU 25, is 30cm long, 30cm wide and 25cm tall. To the west of CU 26 there seemed to be the surface of a bench. There was not time to fully excavate this but it seemed well preserved and it seemed to run fairly far back. At the northern edge of this small room are two different construction units. The first one is CU 27 and this seemed to be a doorway. In total this construction runs 230cm but it is broken up into two different parts. One side abuts up against CU 26 and the other abuts up against CU 16. There is a 50cm gap between the two of these. Just north of this is what could either be a step up to this building or another later wall. CU 28 is 1-2 courses high and made out of rounded river cobble. It runs 230cm long and is 23cm wide and 40cm high. It is aligned at 60°.

In addition to this small room there was also one long wall that runs further south. This construction, CU 29, was 840cm long 43cm wide and 66cm high. It was oriented at 350°, it is 2-4 courses high, and is made of mostly rounded river cobble. It seems as if this construction might have abutted against CU 24 at one point but the northern edge of it was very badly preserved.

This time span like the others was marked mostly by the S. 2 type soil. At the end of this time span this second addition was constructed to the west of the summit and just in front of the oldest wall, CU 1. This small building was much better preserved than the summit and ran much deeper. In addition to this at the end of this time span there is a very well preserved line that runs north south, CU 29. This probably belongs to something further west that was not able to be excavated this season.

Time Span IV

This is the final time span for structure 68. Unlike the other time spans which took place in the late classic this time span most likely took place between the transition time from the late classic to the early post classic. This time span is distinctive due to the fact that instead of actually building the nicer walls that have been seen previously the builders just seemed to throw rocks in a semi straight order and then fill in between it.

The method of construction on the summit followed this perfectly. During this time span they merely piled fill covering up CU 22 from the second time span. The only

construction that seemed left was a very small unpreserved line that looked straight enough to be some sort of plausible construction. This CU 20 is made of both angular and rounded limestone. CU 20 is 146cm long, 29 cm wide and 22cm high and is oriented 250°. Just like this one plausible line in the southwestern corner away from the summit and just east of CU 29 there are more very badly preserved lines that run in many odd directions. These range from CU 30 to CU 41 all of which are made out of limestone except for CU 40 which links this mess of walls to CU 29. CU 30 was instead constructed out of rounded river cobble. In addition to these much smaller lines a large area was constructed in this same way. CU 42 was made out of both limestone and river cobble. It seemed as if the constructors just dumped the rock here in a concentrated mass. This construction is 1020 cm long 150cm wide and 103cm high. It is aligned at an orientation of 74°. On the northern side of the building there was also a one meter square worth of an addition that seemed to have the same kind of construction as CU 42. This was not excavated further but it is probable that another such structure does stretch along the northern edge of Structure 68.

This time span contained S.1, 3, 4, and 5. S. 1 is a dark brown silty topsoil. This is modern ground level. S. 3 is a light brown, hard claylike soil filled with larger rocks. S. 4 is just like S. 1, dark brown and silty but unlike S. 1 it is filled with many sherds. S. 5 is very much like S. 3 but with fewer rocks. At the end of this final time span the two main rooms were entirely covered in by fill as was the area to the east of CU 29. There was a large construction on the southern side and most likely on the northern side that was merely a bunch of rocks concentrated together to form a wall. The entire structure was covered over in this time span of abandonment.
