Fragment of a hollow anthropomorphic seated/kneeling
Figurine possibly a Candelero in its proper right hand
& resting its left hand on its left knee. The legs
are rounded. The Candelero has a flat top with
a horizontal groove dividing the uppermost portion from the
remainder of the body & ventral grooves run along the
body. There is no erosion of the right hand.
The left hand is rectangular & has 5 stubby digits
roughly defined by 4 small grooves. 1 & 2 separated
from the wrist by a deep groove & the wrist itself indistinct
at least 1 cm off center and rectangular. The entire
surface is smooth, conical base. Cast by core & pits
of discolored thinnings. No paint or slip.
