TYPICAL DESCRIPTION:

Paste int. 10gr 5/4

Fragment of a modeled censer. There is a very faint fire core which lies off the center of the break. It is .2cm wide and extends to the wall of the side with a few small bumps and to within .3cm of the opposite wall. The flat sides show faint traces of burning. The surface is smooth, although there is a good deal of temper visible. There are three bumps on one surface and there are a few wide, yet shallow depressions trailing off from these bumps, as if someone had used their thumb to smooth the surface. On the margin facing front in the drawing, there is an incised groove .2cm in diameter .5cm from each edge. The bumps appear to have been pinched up from the surface of the censer. There is no slip or paint - but the grooved edge is slightly lighter in color than the bumpy surface.
