Fragment of a modeled censer which includes a portion of the elongated-U handle and the censer bowl. There is no fine coir, fine clouding, or apparent surface burning. Hardness: 3-2. The surface is fairly smooth. There are brush marks which follow the curvature of the bowl on the bowl's inner surface and brush marks which run along the base of the handle parallel to the handle's margins. The underside of the bowl fragment appears to be quite rough. The handle was probably formed separately and then attached although there are no obvious breaks between it and the handle. The left margin of the handle is quite flat, while the right margin is more rounded. The upper portion of the handle is slightly bumpy - as if it hadn't been smoothed very carefully. There is no slip, paint, or decorative applique.
