Verbal Description

Complex censer prong. No signs of decoration. Longitudinal striations evident along prong. One vent hole at base of prong, rough, oval shape diam = 1.3-1.7 cm. Prong & plate are well charred, both well into the paste of at least 0.2 cm. On plate bottom, least burning is right below vent hole & at most central 1 cm, rest is black or very darkened. On what is left of plate top around ~~centered~~ prong, it is also black, w/ darkest part at either side of prong. Prong burning is heaviest on vent side w/ darkest burny right around & above vent & lightest section of prong on side opposite vent. Though there is significant darkening all around tip & down from tip 6.0 cm.
