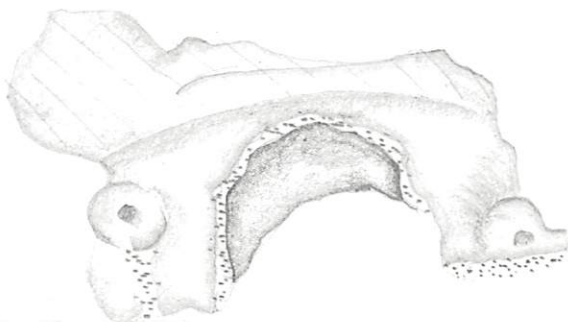

VERBAL DESCRIPTION:

Wonderful hollow mold-made, anthropomorphic fig frag with the lower portion of the head, the neck, the upper portion of the shoulders, and two dangling, punctated puffy doughnut ear flares. There is a white slip below the chin and above the open neckline. There is red slip on the shoulder and below the ridge which delineates the open line. The face is gone. One of the earflares has been suspended from a narrow strip of clay (the other was probably similarly affixed). The back of the head is slightly convex, the back of the shoulder margin is flat, but the figurine back begins to curve anterior later from the fragment's edge. The neck is solid - the head + body are two separate hollow chambers - the entire figurine wasn't one hollow entity. Central long core 3cm in diameter on body, no big core within the head. No big clays (clay).
