Frog Ocarina

This example is a double-chambered ocarina with a conical support. The instrument depicts a frog with forwardly mounted eyes (the eyes are punctated, applied ovals) and a centered, appliqued, doubly punctated nose. The nose rests on top of the mouth which is delineated by a horizontal groove. The top of

the frog's head is accentuated by two raised areas, one of which (the animal's left side) also serves as a functional stop. Interestingly enough, the other peak does not appear to include a functional stop. The chamber is divided by a flange which cuts down through the center of the chamber, although it articulates with the bottom of the chamber, it does not intermesh with it. There might have been a second conical support on the other side of the instrument, as the remaining support is off-center. The interior of the chamber is rough.
