perhaps both eyes; yet difficult to tell for sure.

Describe the figurative or decorative portion of the exterior:

whole head of a frog-looking animal w/ a headdress-type crown on the head. The face is very triangle shaped w/ no other facial features than eyes. The eyes appear as if they could have been added + then the pupils were incised in. The "crown"-like headdress has a ridge directly above the head + then another smaller one w/ small vertically incised lines. Could be an addition to an even larger + more elaborate headdress or simply a vessel in itself. (Carlos mentioned that it could be a human nose w/ things in the nostrils if it were turned upside down.)

The item is: not eroded - slightly - moderately - very extremely eroded.
