The item is: not eroded - slightly - moderately - very - extremely eroded.

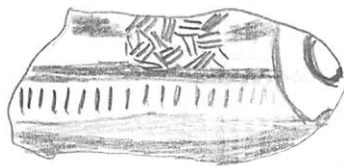
