VERBAL DESCRIPTION: This is a whole partial complex censer prong. This piece is from: near the bowl - the middle the distal, pointed end - a whole profile. A part of the bowl/plate area is - is not attached.

There is is not a vent hole. Diameter: unclear

If a distal end, it is flattened - rounded - pointed. The pointed end is - is not worn or abraded.

There are are not darkened/burnt areas. Where? Half of exterior is grayed.

There are - are not orange or red blotches. Where?

There is is not a firing core. If present it is centrally located - shifted towards interior.

The exterior is smoothed - striated - brushed - lumpy uneven (undulating) other (describe).

There is - is not a scar near the distal, i.e., pointed, end from modeled decoration.

Slip: yes - no If yes, describe.

Paint: yes - no If yes, describe.

The piece is not eroded / is: slightly - moderately - very - extremely - eroded.

Comments: Vent hole appears to have been on the end. Interior has finger gouges, clay overlaps, possible finishing striations. Exterior is very irregular.
