Whole head w/ large portion of a neck preserved, but w/ nose partially broken off. Can't tell if anthropomorphic or zoomorphic. Large donut-shaped eyes have been appliqueed on as well as a large nose-like feature w/ big incised nostrils on both sides. Slits along both sides of mouth indicate possibly the lips or mouth was slightly open.

The exterior shows the following manufacturing marks: none - smoothing - wiping - finger smears - finger prints - scraping - striations - lumps of clay - seams from molding - trimming - other (describe).

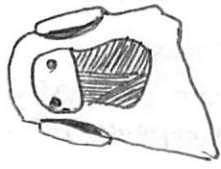
