COMMENTS/DESCRIPTIONS ^{Four} Jicoro Grp sherds are heavily burnt and pocked / roughened on the interior. Many have a higher than usual mica content. The Miravalles is very crude in paste, indistinguishable from a mediocre Jicoro. The La Champa bowl rim is in an unusually orange paste. The polychrome is thoroughly burnt - - classified as Uluca, but not firmly.

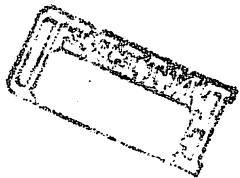
