Additional descriptive comments on figurative or decorative portion of the exterior: This seems to be the left leg of a human. The foot is a rectangle with 4 vertical lines making it into 5 toes. Above this is a plain band, maximally 0.76cm thick. Above this is another band, max. 0.63cm thick, with 5 short lines on it; looks like a decorative above-the-knee band.
