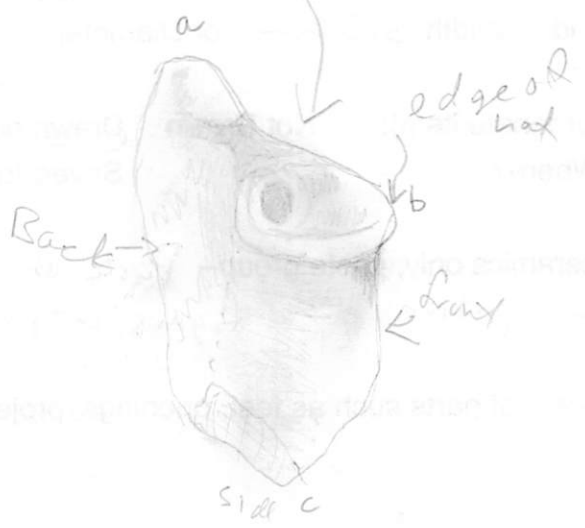
Probably molded.
