Measurements (of pieces; of parts such as feet, openings, projections, etc.) n/a

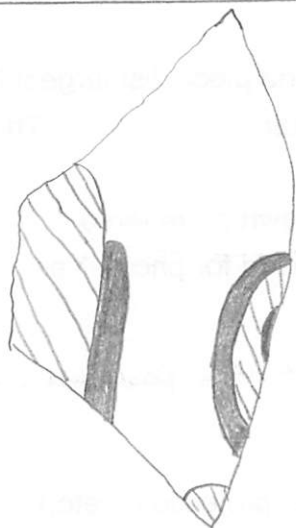
Condition (eroded; uneroded; burnt-where? how much?; etc.): Sherd itself seems pretty eroded - on the interior there is a bit of chipping on the step. The exterior is also fairly eroded - not much of the paint showing through

Use wear, marking: rounded edge is somewhat smoother than the other edges, although none of them are truly smooth

Manufacturing marks or other info about how it was made: Edges are straight - not beveled.

Decoration: two red ovaly shaped figs outlined in black.

Other interesting, useful info: Looks like it was made from a piece of a Cythriden vessel
