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3 July -

CENSER BAGS That just have DONE in red on them only means that it has been listed out somewhere, in someone's notes. People with these notes are Sylvia, Steve, Sharon Vanessa, Becky & perhaps Krista.

Censer stuff has been really divided up by Sylvia - the organizational system is not my own & not one that I feel works particularly well as there are 1/2 hundred bits of censers everywhere. Supposedly Becky knows what is going on.

Coding still seems to be working out well. Some pairs are frustrating because they do not match codes & too much is happening to describe what is going on.

We are all caught up on Steps. Quigley draws them as they come up & we are trying to keep up w/ them. What we are lacking now are censuses & jewelry. We need to have a decommission day & a censer paste day.
