38D is a 12.4 m trench N/S over structure 1A59. This is an oblong mound overlooking the ball court. The construction techniques at least on the E end of this mound appear to be extremely informal as only cobble is apparent, no cut stone appears in this trench. In '88 another excavation up the center of this mound's N side, facing the ball court, revealed nice terrace walls. 38D, though is not disturbed by root activity, nothing like this was discernable or apparent.

Another trench 38G extends up the W side of the same mound, running N/S parallel to 38D. Perhaps final comparisons of these two trenches, coupled with the work done in '88 on this mound will reveal more about the structure.

I present now some general conclusions and theories in respect to 38D and its relationship to the ball court and cluster of mounds.

From 38D trench, it is not obvious where the entrance to this structure ~~was~~ was, although it seems to me it is probably from the S, since '88 showed bench like terraces facing the ball court.

Not much came out of this trench in terms of artifacts. In fact I had several empty lots. I did find some sherds and obsidian. This, to me, suggests that perhaps this structure had a more formal function and was kept cleaner than most areas. I will be curious to see if sherds suggest formality or something more utilitarian.

The construction takes place in the humus layer. This suggests that the ash/sand found apr. 60-80 cm deep around the site is from a previous occupation.

Finally, I will be interested in determining if this structure ties in more closely with the living cluster here on this hill, the ball court at the bottom of this hill, or both.

It's hard to say because the construction techniques used for both walls are similar; uniform medium sized cobbles with chinking stones underneath. If any part of The Courtship of Eddie's Father substantially predates Laverne & Shirley, I would guess it would be the part that is essentially a line.

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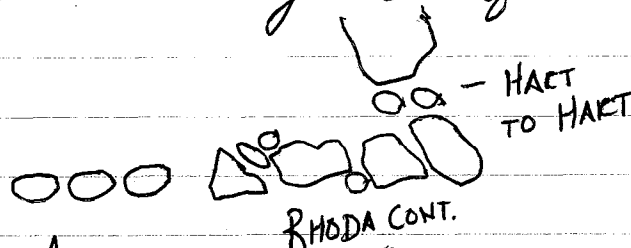

So, it would be feasible that the basal platform was constructed up to the point where Scarscrow and Mrs. King end on the N, and Lavonne and Shirley and the rest of Courtship was added on later. Perhaps the basal platform served as a living surface first, then the secondary platform was added later. The only clear way of finding this out would be to excavate through the platform.

It would seem just as feasible to me that the structure was made at one time since looking at the profile of Rhoda and I Dream of Jeannie shows no basal rocks from an earlier platform. If Scarscrow was part of an earlier platform along with the Courtship of Eddie's Father, I would expect to see more lines like those in profile under the second platform, and I don't see them there. Nor do I see sheds deep in the profile which would indicate previous use.

- Hart to Hart and the continuation of Rhoda past the platform look, to me, like a late effort to add on a terrace.

The construction of Rhoda changes from nice uniform cobble and chinking stones to cut block remnants. It might have been prettier than the cobble wall at one time, but looking at it now, I am doubtful. Hart to Hart has the same strange mixture of rocks.



- Waltons and Patty Duke also have very different construction techniques, though they seemingly serve the same purpose of a walkway.

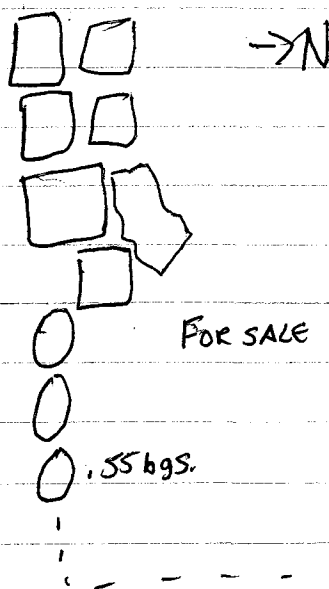
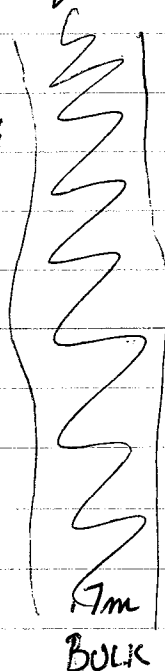
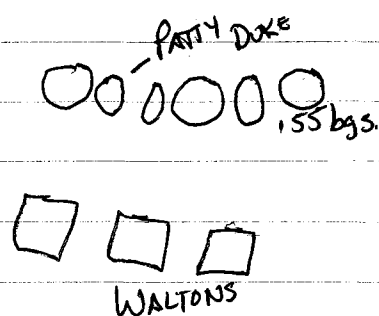

By setting up a datum point with a line level between Structure L and 1A57, it is apparent that the front terraces of 1A57 start at .55m bgs. as do the cobbles of Patty Duke. Thus, perhaps it is safe to say that at one time both structures were occupied co-temporally.

The wallway of Structure L opens up to the cobble part of the 1A57 terraces. Perhaps the informal part of the terrace facade has formal, yet still formal outside building for work.



Finally, the orientations on lots of these parallel lines are within only a few degrees of each other.

For instance I can now see Mrs. King is at 20°

This indicates some meticulous handy work and specialization to me. It makes this open air structure more formal, which makes me tie it in with the cut stones of 1A57 more confidently.

1A57 is a unique building in that the summit features were constructed right on the dirt. It was a living area, a house, with a formal S front and an informal extension of a cobble terrace and platform to the E. The informal constructions are oriented to face the informal open air / workshop area of Structure S's entrance way.

The building 1A57 seems to have gone through, at least ^{two} ~~three~~ construction phases. First, extending an E platform and E cobble terrace, then extending the terrace S, ~~and extending~~ ~~original summit lines to said areas.~~

No post holes can be seen, but some bajareque was found leading me to believe the superstructure was bajareque. At one point, more contemporary people (1920's-50's) seem to have been using this mound as a refuse heap for house building materials: shingles, nails, metal scraps, etc. But, generally, the area is fairly well preserved.

Many, probably six, obsidian cores were found associated with the S terrace, For Sale, and the inside summit features of this structure. Most were found outside For Sale and to the E of the structure near 1A59. The test pits at the base of the natural rise 1A57 and Structure S are constructed of turned up lots of obsidian flakes. This leads me to believe the people here were working lots of obsidian blades and arrowheads, like the one in S. Across the site in Structure C and X, similar refuse has been found.

A burial was found behind A Light in the Altis and could be associated with the second construction phase.

Hopefully an analysis of artifacts and soils will tell me more about function and construction of 1A57 and the surrounding cluster.

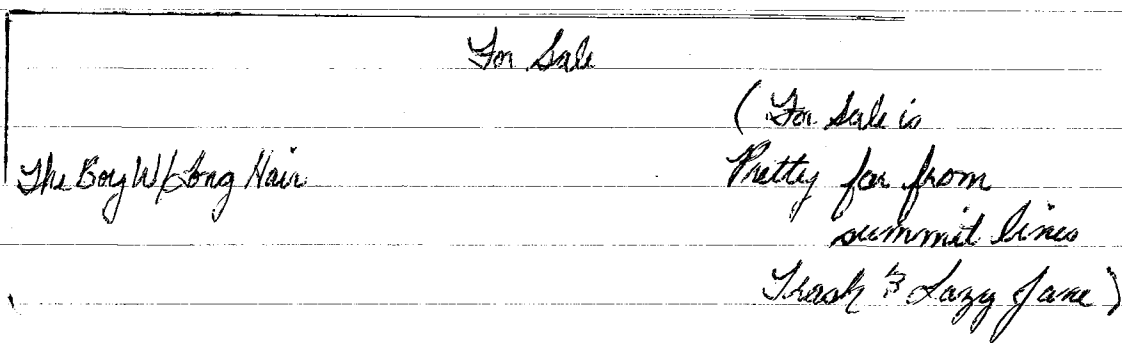
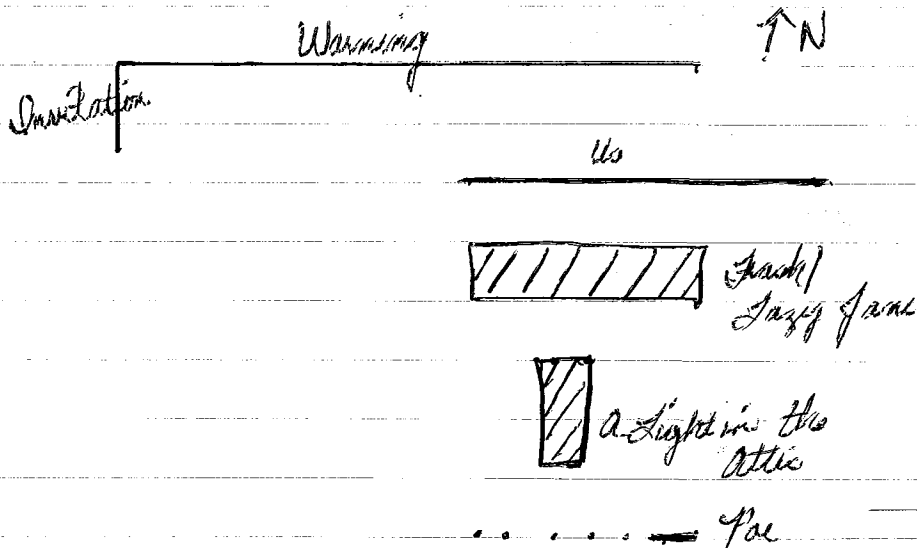

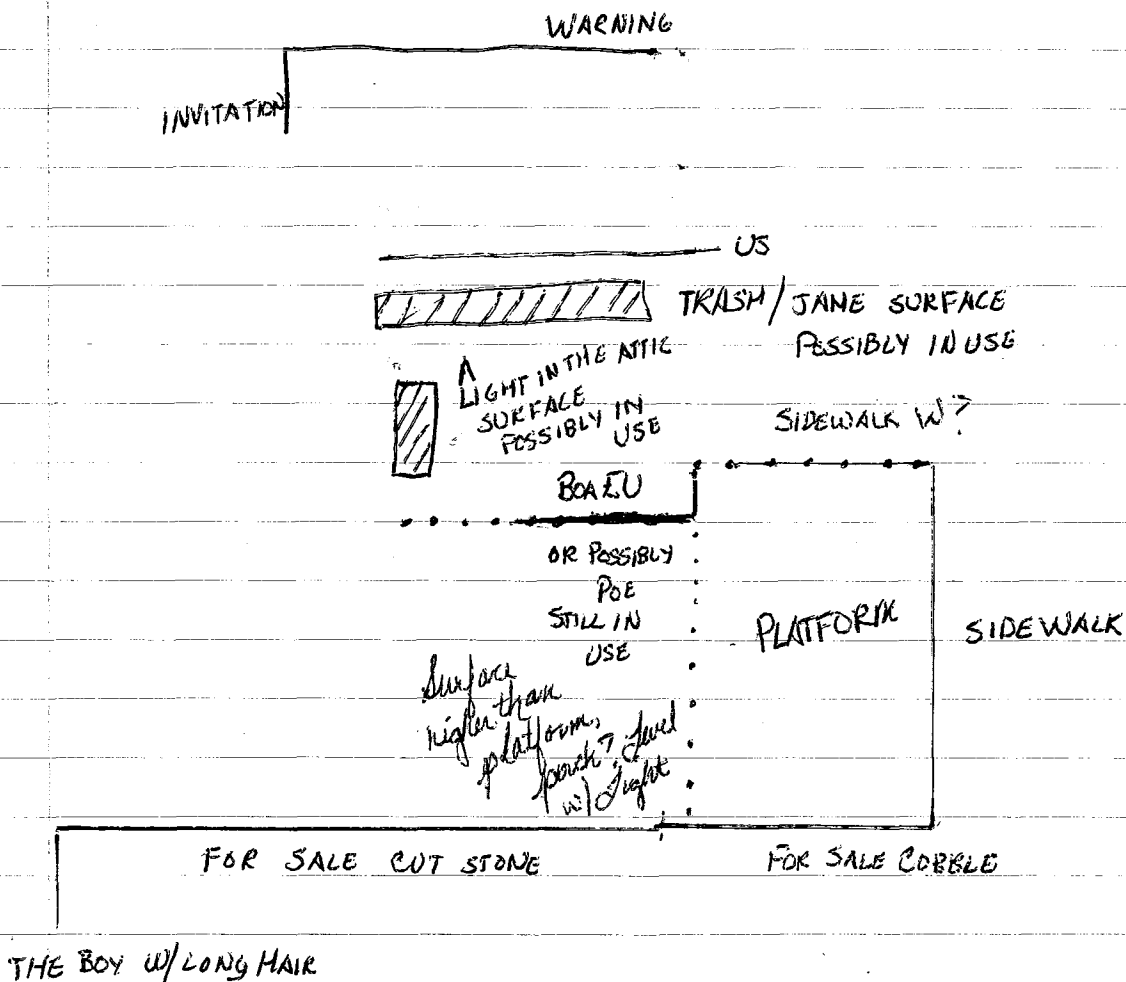

2 Poe was raised into Boa Constrictor E of Whale Upper. Cobble was added to For Sale's W side and where the Sidewalk Ends was constructed to form a SW corner with For Sale. Sidewalk may have turned W to join Emily Dickinson's as Sidewalk seems to precede Anne Bradstreet in construction. It is under Bradstreet. This would form the first platform/porch for 1A57.

Dirt might have been deposited to create a living surface level with the platform, thus covering the base of A Light in the Attic and Trash/Jenny Jane/Uo. Perhaps the surface of A Light in the Attic was used. It was during this deposition that the body was probably buried behind A Light in the Attic. I believe the soil here is fill dirt because of the high density shard concentration in the W profile corresponding to these "old" features and a soil consisting of dark brown clay-like dirt with possible lime deposits. A little different from other areas in the trench.

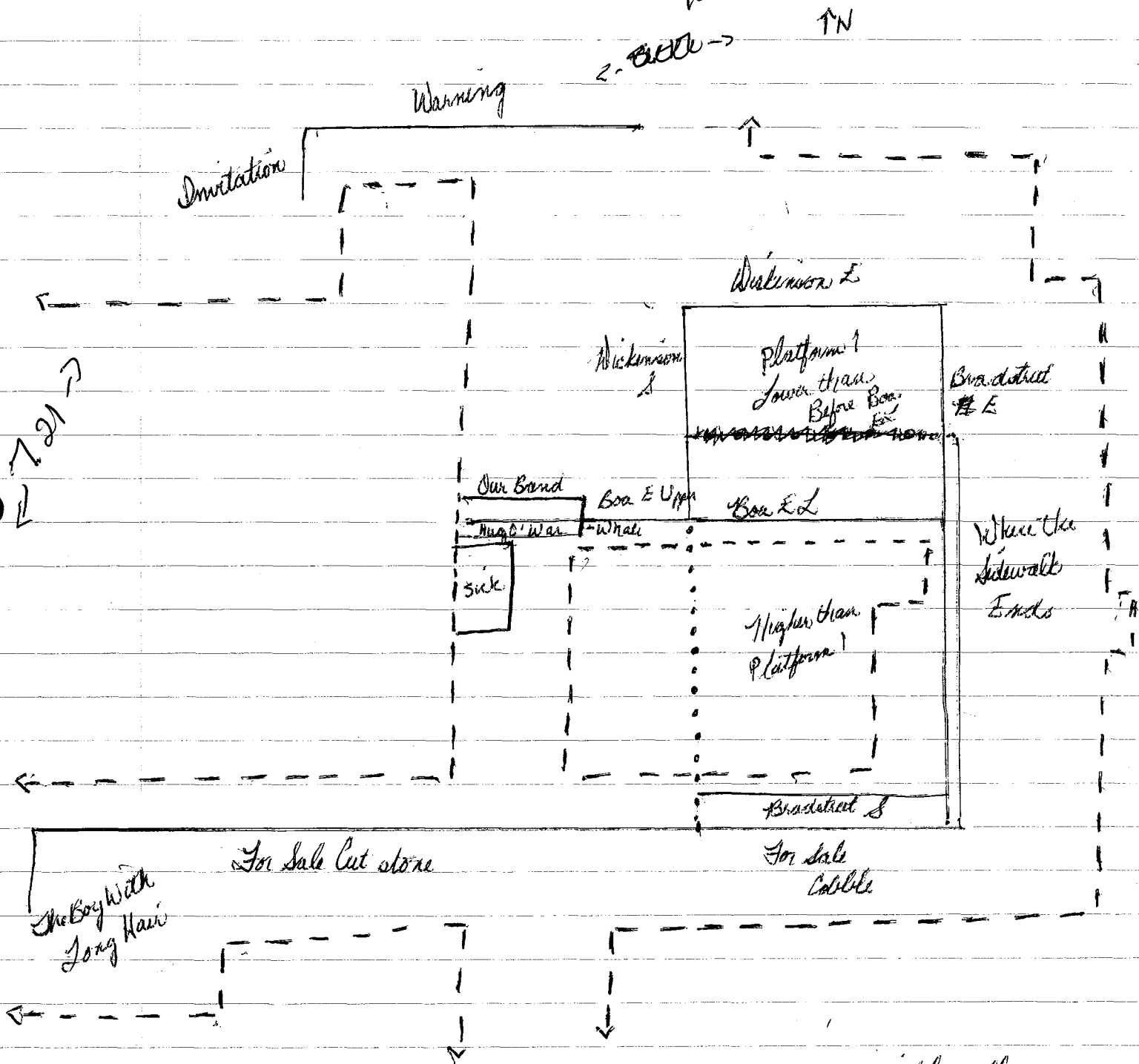

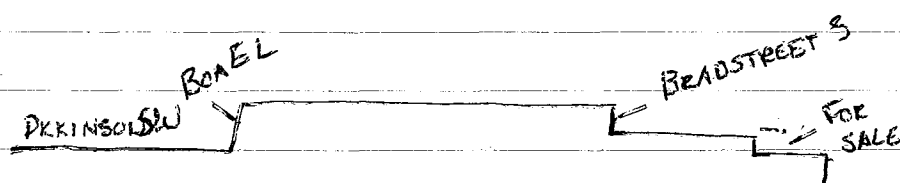

Since construction methods of summit lines Boa, Uva Band, and Nug O'War use the same types & colours of river cobble (small- & medium - red to grey) it can be argued that Sick, Trash, Tight, and summit lines were in use at all times. A Tight & Trash would not have been covered then as summit lines & platform were extended.

Also, a common construction technique was to skirt basal walls. Thus Sidewalk skirts Bradstreet. This probably makes more sense than calling Sidewalk an original basal wall since it doesn't show up in the platform profile W face. I have no idea, though, why it ends before Bradstreet, S of Bradstreet corner.

Anyway, these ideas simplify the building and construction phases. Essentially the first version could have been as it is minus the cobble terrace & platform & the extensions of Boa Constructor.

This does not answer for me:

1. The different soil at the back of A Tight.
2. The burial at back of Tight - I would have showed if this structure was uncovered.
3. The use or non use of Toe.
4. The end of Sidewalk.

It does explain -

1. What happened to these features - Trash & Tight and lets them define rooms.

38G and 38D North transect 1A58. 1A58 is an important structure because it faces the ball court and also ties in with the possible obsidian manufacturing center. An extensive comparison between 38D & 38G is imperative to understanding this structure. The West end of 1A58 had considerably more shrubs than the E (38D) which had virtually none. The N side of 1A58 is poorly preserved due to root activity & downhill erosion, though it seems that there were terraces facing the ballcourt. These terraces produced little or no artifacts - they were probably swept pretty clean.

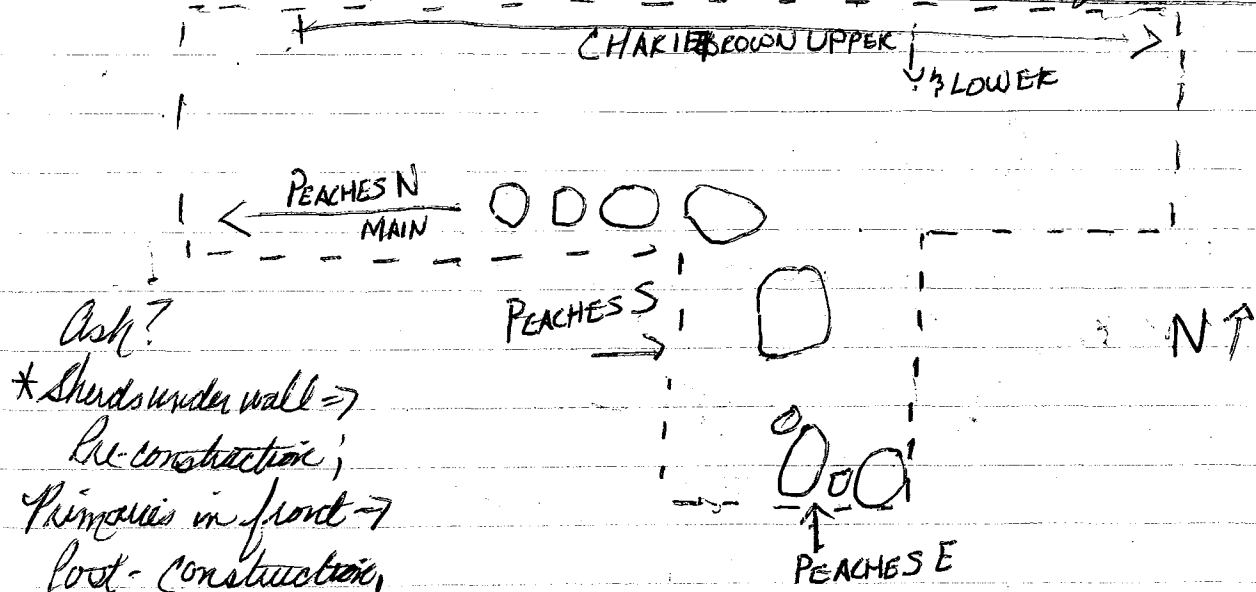
Only a comparative analysis with 38D will help solve structure 1A58 along with glances back to the aerial trench through the North Central part of this mound in 1988.

The datum for 38G is 116 m above actual ground surface at the pt. It is on the summit, W of the orig. W trench wall, even with the center of Jolly Beans
