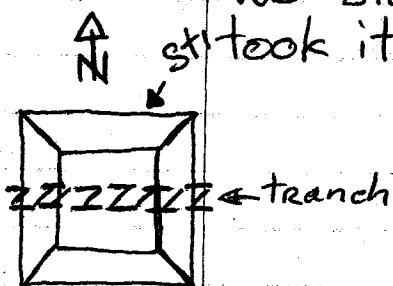
Morning:

We chose our mound, cleared it. Put the trench line down oriented E-W. The trench is 17 m long and 1 m wide. And we did a surface collection, pretty poor in this mound (St1).

Surface collection = Lot \emptyset

Afternoon:

We started digging in 400 N. 600 E Lot 1 and we took it down to centimeters (rich ceramics)



1/31/95

Morning:

we finished excavating Lot 1 and dug Lot 2 (400N-601E Level 1 0-10cm), Lot 3 (400N-

616E Level 1 0-10cm), Lot 4 (400N-600E Level 2 10-20cm) and Lot 5 (400N-617E Level 1 0-10cm)

We found a stamp in Lot 2, the stamp is in really good shape, the only pieces missing are part of the handle and a little piece on the ~~in~~ edge, the design represents dancing monkeys.

No wall coming in Lot 1, Lot 2, Lot 4

Lot 4 is really rich in Ceramics.

The Lot 3 is dense in rocks but looks like tumble and ~~apparently~~ apparently keep going in Lot 5 and 6 (400N-617E Level 2 10-20cm) but a lot less dense.

The Lots 3, 5, 6 are not really rich in Ceramics.

Lots 4, 7 (400N-600E Level 3 20-40cm*) are ~~rich~~ dense in Ceramics. it's ~~like~~ looks like the ceramics

~~were eroded down~~ were eroded down.

*we missed a level because problem communication.

P.S.: I had to expand the trench 1 more m on the East Side

Afternoon:

Continued the dig of Lot 7 and start digging in Lot 8 (400N-617E Level 3 20 → 30cm). We may find a platform in 400N-617E who was ~~East~~ East of St 1. there's still a lot of ceramics in Lot 7. we may be in midden in Lot 9. we got a ceramics floor in Lot 11 (400N-600E L5 50 → 60cm) refer to [Lot 9 (400N-600E L4 40 → 50cm)] draw D95-63-01

2/1/95

Morning:

we took out the ceramics floor in Lot 11. ^{we will keep} ~~excavating~~ excavating in Lot 10 (400N-617E L4 30 → 40cm) and will begin Lot 12 (400N-617E L5 40 → 50cm) there is no platform yet.

Lot 11 is still really dense in Ceramic, we may get close to the living floor. we found an over piece of figurine (Hand and Arm parts) in Lot 4.

We found also a entier incense burner (Monkey Face) in Lot 9. The obsidian is more dense in Lot 12 (1 blade ~~and~~ + a few blade fragments) so we did screen the final centimeters. we found one more piece of figurine (Face part) in Lot 4.

we started digging in Lot 13 (400N-617E L6 50 → 60cm) and screen the dirt ~~in~~ to see if we are not missing any obsidian tools.

we started excavating in Lot 14 (400N-600E L6 60 → 70cm), this lot is dense in Ceramic as the levels above it. I believe we are in a midden.

We found a whistle with a nonhuman face in Lot 13 and a fragment of figurine. No obsidian was found in the screening in Lot 13.

Morning:

We started excavating the Lot 15=(400N-617E L7 60 → 70 cm) and Lot 16=(400N-600E L7 70 → 80 cm).

The Lot 16 seems less dense in Ceramics.

~~There was~~ In Lot 15, it looks like we found the platform that was near to the East side of the mound (St1). This platform is predates of the mound by stratigraphy. Something seems organized in 400N-616E, like a wall.

We may get to the living floor in ~~the~~ Lot 16 because the ceramics is dense again. I'm going to open one more square meter on the north side of 400N-617E, to see what's going on with the rocks that sound organized in stratigraphy, this is going to be Lot 17=(401N-617E Level 10 → 10cm)

In Lot 16, the sediment until now has been brown top soil and changed to a silty texture. We started digging the Lot 17, nothing special right now except ceramics and obsidian.

We started excavating the Lot 18=(400N-600E L8 80 → 90 cm) and the Lot 19=(401N-617E L2 10 → 20 cm). The ceramics is still dense in Lot 18. Lot 20=(400N-600E Level 9 90 → 100cm) this Lot seems really dense in Paint Ceramics. Lot 19 don't give me more information.

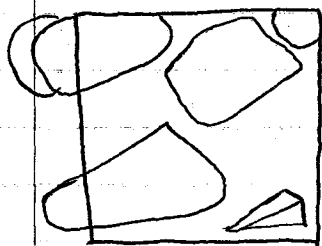
Afternoon:

There's ~~some~~ a small quantity of charbon in Lot 20. We started digging Lot 21=(401N-617E L3 20 → 30cm). We had to stop digging in 400N-600E by security (too deep). The Lot 20 had also some ~~to~~ daub and we found many pieces from a single vessel. There is some ~~burned~~ daub + some charbon on the SE corner

Morning:

We finished digging the Lot 20 that's going to be the last level down in 400N-600E. Lot 23 = (401N-

617E Level 4 30-40 cm), this Lot looks like a wall but is not consistent with the structure 1, this wall may go with another structure NE of St 1. We are not going to dig more in 401N-617E for now, but we are going to dig again in 400N-616E to see what's going on, and take out some rocks that look like tumble. ~~Start~~ We started to excavate

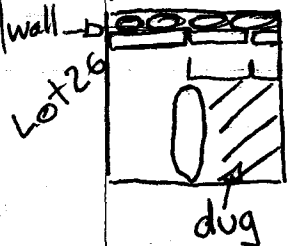
again in 400N-601E (Lot 22) and take it down to 20 cm. Lot 22 is dense with ceramics, no organization to the rocks right now. We started to dig again in 400N-616E (Lot 24 L2 10-20 cm), we get one of the wall of the structure 1, the wall is oriented N-S (Lot 24). We dug one quart of 400N-616E to Level 3 (20-30 cm) (Lot 26). We found a piece

of Figurine in Lot 25 (face part). Lot 25 = 400N-601E L3 20-30 cm. In Lot 26, the wall ended up being stairs, we started to dig the over part of 400N-616E L3 to see the all stairs. The stairs may keep

going farther up the mound (in 400N-615E)

Afternoon: We dug ~~the~~ Lot 27 (400N-601E L4 30-40 cm) that's still rich in ceramics. In the over quart of Lot 26, the stairs keep going and are really done. There's in the south wall ~~the~~ trench of 400N-616E a lot of rocks but most of it looks like tumble, we dug Lot

29 (400N-601E L5 40 → 50cm) that's is rich in Ceramics. We started ~~last~~ excavating Lot 28 (400N-615 L1 0 → 10cm) today but too early to say anything.

Morning:

We cleaned the surface of Lot 29 and kept excavating this Lot, we did the same thing for Lot 28. Lot 29 is rich in Ceramics. Lot 28 looks like tumble, we may get the continuity of the stairs in Lot 30 (400N-615E L2 10 → 20cm). Lot 29 doesn't have anything like a wall, there's a few rocks but they look like tumble. We may get something in the next square meter (400N-602E). Lot 30 has the continuity of the stairs but I will open one more meter in Lot 31 (400N-614E L1 0 → 10cm) to see what's going on with some of the rocks (if it's the continuity of the stairs or the start of a wall). We started excavating a little more in 400N-616E L4 30 → 40cm = Lot 33, to see what's going on with the vertical big rock. In Lot 32 (400N-602E L1 0 → 10cm) we have a wall but there's probably some tumble around it, so we excavated one more level down to Lot 34 (400N-602E L2 10 → 30cm). Lot 31 is full of tumble, we are not finding anything cultural in this Lot. Lot 34 doesn't give us much information, so we ~~open~~ excavated more down, Lot 35 (400N-602E L3 30 → 40cm).

Afternoon: In Lot 33, the Lot where the stairs start, we have a vertical big flat rock under the "First" step that looks ~~like~~ to be a support for the stairs, we dug more down with Lot 36 (400N-616E L5 40 → 50cm) to see how deep it goes.

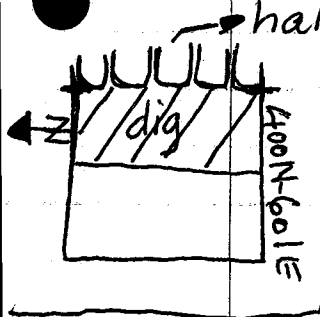

In Lot 35, we Found a wall with preform rocks (rectangular) in the outside wall, this wall looks really well done. Lot 36 is rich in Ceramics.

2/7/95

Morning:

We started digging Lot 37 (400N-603E L1 0 → 10cm) to get a better view of the wall, and we kept excavating in 400N-614E with 38 (L2 10 → 20cm). Lot 37 looks like tumble, same thing for Lot 38 but there is one preform rock in the S/W corner. We kept digging in 400N-614E with Lot 39 (L3 20 → 30cm). We started excavating Lot 40 (400N-603E L2 10 → 20cm) and we found an obsidian core in this Lot. We started digging in 400N-601E (L6 50 → 60cm) Lot 41 but only half of the square meter by security, to see how far down the wall in 400N-602E goes. In Lot 39, the stairs keep going and they are still made of preform rocks. I took out some rocks in Lot 30 that I thought were part of the stairs but ending up to not make sense with Lot 39. Lot 41, we don't have the continuity of the cut rock but we may get the continuity of the wall with some round rocks. We kept excavating down to Lot 42 (400N-601E L7 60 → 70cm). We started digging Lot 43 (400N-613E L1 0 → 10cm) to get the continuity of the stairs. In Lot 30 and 39 there are some steps missing that may explain the Large Flats rocks we had in Lot 23 (2 large Flats rocks and 2 over in the wall's trench). In Lot 42 we may have the base of the wall. We kept excavating in Lot 35 to find the width of the wall.

Afternoon: Lot 43 had tumble. We may get the continuity of the stairs but not with preform rocks, but round rocks. Lot 35 looks like tumble right now. we kept excavating in 400N-613E (L2 10-20cm) with Lot 44. We excavated Lot 45 (400N-603E L3 20-30cm) but this lot had only tumble. We started excavating in Lot 47 (400N-612E L1 0-10cm) to get the continuity of the stairs. We started digging again in 400N-616E (L6 60-70cm) with Lot 48, to see the relation between the platform and the stairs. This Lot is also rich in Ceramics.

2/8/95

Morning:

We kept excavating in Lot 47 (400N-612E L1 0-10cm) and we started digging in Lot 49 (400N-603E L4 30-40cm). After we finish digging in Lot 48 (400N-616E) and find the relation between the beginning of the stairs and the platform, I will start to draw the features. Lot 47 is not rich in Ceramics (just a few sherds). We kept excavating in 400N-612E (L2 10-20cm) Lot 50. We started excavating Lot 51 (400N-603E L5 40-50cm). Lot 49 had tumble and was poor in any artifacts. I don't really know what's going on in Lot 51 if there is another wall or if it's still part of the 1st wall. After Ed's help, Lot 51 had a wall that is not really well preserved. In Lot 50, we have some flat rocks that may be the continuity of the stairs but those steps are really not well preserved. We started excavating in Lot 52 (400N-604E L1 0-10cm). We kept excavating in Lot 48.

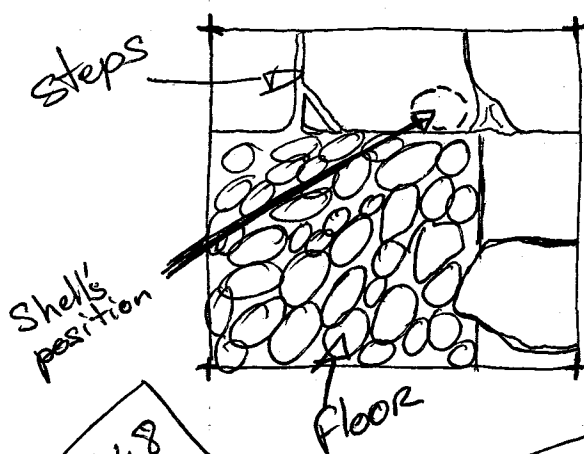
Afternoon:

We kept excavating in Lot 48 and 52. Lot 52 had only a few sherds and looks like tumble ~~is~~ right now.

We started excavating in Lot 53 (400N-604E L2 10-20cm). We found some strange shells in Lot 48 in The N/W Corner. Those shells are 65cm under the "First" step and are directly on the platform's floor. I drew the position of the shells (D95-63-03).



I took out the shells, there's the possibility of making some soil sample because 1 of the shells still has 2 parts together and the dirt between those hasn't been contaminated. There are no special artifacts associated with those shells. I haven't had the opportunity to draw the features today.

2/9/95

Morning:

We kept excavating in 400N-604E (L3 20-30cm) Lot 54. And we kept digging Lot 48 to find the connection between the stairs and the platform that is not clear right now. The rock that is the support of the "First" step doesn't go all the way to the platform's floor, the rock stops 30-33cm above the floor and the floor goes under the stairs. We started excavating in Lot 55 (400N-611E L1 0-10cm). Lot 55 had only a few sherds and it looks like there's a terrace but it's in pretty bad shape. Lot 54 may have a terrace ~~also~~ too, we started digging in Lot 56 (400N-605E L1 0-10cm) to see if the terrace kept going. We also started excavating in Lot 57 (400N-610E L1 0-10cm) to see if we get the continuity of the terrace. Lot 55 and 56 are really poor in Artifacts. We excavated Lot 58 (400N-605E L2 10-20cm) that had only

Afternoon:

→ We started digging Lot 59 (400N-605E L3 20→30 cm) and Lot 60 (400N-609E L1 0→10 cm). Lot 59 may have a wall and a terrace. Lot 60 had a step (the step is made with a flat rock) and may be a wall not well preserved. We excavated Lot 61 (400N-606E L1 0→10 cm) that may be a terrace. We started excavating Lot 62 (400N-608E L1 0→10 cm) and Lot 63 (400N-607E L1 0→10 cm) that is the 2 last meters of the trench. Those Lots are tumble.

2/10/95

Morning:

We kept excavating in Lot 62 and took out the rocks there were tumble. We also took out some rocks in Lot 59 (400N-605E L3 20→30 cm) than I thought were a wall line but Ed said that those were tumble. ~~We kept~~ We started digging in Lot 64 (400N-606E L2 10→20 cm) and Lot 65 (400N-608E L2 10→20 cm). Lot 65 had some ceramics and some bajareque. Lot 64 doesn't have any artifacts, we may get a wall in the west trench's wall. We also kept excavating in 400N-609E (L2 10→20 cm) with Lot 66, at the base of the wall. Lot 66 had the expansion of the wall and only had a couple sherds. We started excavating Lot 67 (400N-608E L3 20→30 cm) to see what's going on after the wall, the wall is about 1m 20 wide and it's located between 400N-609E and 400N-610E. We excavated Lot 68 (400N-608E L4 30→40 cm). We kept excavating in 400N-611E (L2 10→20 cm) Lot 69 because we may get something a little deeper.

We kept digging Lot 70 (400N-606E L3 20 → 30cm). We found the other side of the wall in Lot 70, this wall is about 80cm wide and is located in 400N-605E.

Afternoon:

We kept digging Lots 69 and 70. We may have a terrace in Lot 69. The cobbles in Lot 70 was tumble and doesn't have any artifacts. We started excavating Lot 71 (400N-610E L2 10 → 20cm) I think This lot had the continuity of the terrace in Lot 69. We dug Lot 72 (400N-606E L4 30 → 40cm) and Lot 73 (400N-606E L5 40 → 50cm). Those lots gave the thing as Lot 70, except Lot 73 that had artifacts. We started excavating Lot 74 (400N-607E L2 10 → 20cm). Lot 74 is tumble. We started digging Lot 75 (400N-608E L5 40 → 50cm) and Lot 76 (400N-607E L3 20 → 30cm). Lot 75 and 76 were tumble and have few artifacts.

2/13/95

Morning:

We started excavating Lot 77 (400N-608E L6 50 → 60cm) and 78 ~~was~~ (400N-607E L4 30 → 50cm). We found a chert bifacial tool in Lot 77. Lot 77 and 78 were tumble and fill there's no cultural features right now. We started digging Lot 79 (400N-607E L5 50 → 60cm) and Lot 80 (400N-608E L7 60 → 70cm). Lot 79 and 80 are tumble and fill. We are done digging in this area. Now, we are going to dig in the East side based on 400N-616E and go with 2 different crew North and South at the same time, this is going to let us know where are the corners and stairs stop, but we need to move the dirt pile.

Because we started digging perpendicular to the trench we have to verify some different points.

Afternoon:

We have to verify in 400N-611E and 400N-610E if there is a wall running perpendicular to the wall in between 400N-609E and 400N-610E. We also have to verify if the wall in the south trench's wall in 400N-608E, this wall will be running perpendicular to the wall in between 400N-609E and 400N-610E. So we started digging Lot 81 (400N-611E L3 20 → 30 cm) and Lot 82 (400N-605E L4 30 → 40 cm). We found a new wall in Lot 81 that is perpendicular to the trench. We started digging Lot 83 (400N-610E L3 20 → 30 cm). In Lot 82 we have the continuity of the wall. In Lot 83 we have the continuity of the wall 400N-609E, 400N-610E except that the remaining is confused. So we started excavating more in Lot 84 (400N-610E L4 30 → 40 cm). Lot 82 we have very nice continuity of the wall 400N-605E, this lot had some ceramics and bone. Lot 84 is confused.

2/14/95 * Lot 87 (400N-611E L4 30 → 70 cm)

Morning:

We started excavating in Lot 85 (400N-608E L8 70 → 80 cm) to see if there is a wall in the south trench's wall. We kept digging Lot 86 (400N-610E L5 40 → 70 cm)*. I think Lot 85 could be a wall. The wall in Lot 85 could be a intern wall that may turn in the south/west corner of 400N-608E. In Lot 86 we have the continuation of the wall in 400N-610E but in this Lot and Lot 87 we don't have the continuation of the wall line than we had in Lots 69 and 71. We started excavating in the East side of the mound

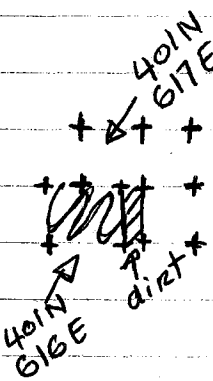

perpendicular of the axe 400N. I have to let a profile block, the thing I didn't do for 401N-617E so the next meter up is going to have a decalage of 30 cm and I'm keeping the same grid system (cf: D95-63-02). We started digging in Lot 88 (401N-616E L1 0-10cm) and Lot 89 (399N-616E L1 0-10cm). Lots 88 and 89 are Fill, these lots have some sherds, we kept excavating. Lot 90 (401N-616E L2 10-20cm) and Lot 91 (399N-616E L2 10-20cm). Lot 90 had the continuity of the stairs still made in cut stones, this lot had few sherds. Lot 91 is still a mix of fill and tumble but there is a cut stone in the north-west corner. We kept excavating Lot 92 (399N-616E L3 20-30cm) and Lot 93 (401N-616E L3 20-30cm). Lot 93 had the continuation of the stairs but I want us to dig 1 more lot to see if we have 1 more step, so we started excavating Lot 94 (401N-616E L4 30-40cm).

Afternoon:

We kept excavating Lot 92 and 94. Lot 92 also had the continuation of the stairs still made in cut stones. So we kept digging to 40 cm Lot 95 (399N-616E L4 30-40cm). Lot 94 doesn't have any other steps but we are going to dig 1 more lot to make sure, Lot 96 (401N-616E L5 40-50cm). Lot 95 doesn't have any other steps either so we started excavating another lot to be sure, Lot 97 (399N-616E L5 40-50cm). Lot 96 and 97 don't have any other steps.

Morning:

We ~~kept~~ set up the all trench N/S based on 400N-616E and we started digging Lot 98 (402N-616E L1 0 → 10cm) and Lot 99 (398N-616E L1 0 → 10cm) to reveal the corner of the structure. Lot 98 is Fill and has few sherds and Lot 99 is a mix of Fill and tumble and has few sherds. We kept excavating Lot 100 (402N-616E L2 10 → 20cm) and Lot 101 (398N-616E L2 10 → 20cm). Lot 100 has a wall in the south trench's wall so we started digging Lot 102 (402N-615E L1 0 → 10cm). After looking at 101, the corner is in between 399N-616E and 398N-616E so we are going to dig Lot 103 (399N-615E L1 0 → 10cm). Lot 102 has a lot of tumble (with few cut stones), so we are going to dig Lot 104 (402N-615E L1 0 → 10cm) to get more information. Lot 103 is also tumble but has a lot of cut stones. We kept excavating Lot 105 (399N-615E L2 10 → 20cm). I don't really see what's going on in Lot 105, so we started digging Lot 106 (399N-615E L3 20 → 30cm).

Afternoon:

We kept excavating Lot 106 and took out some rocks in Lot 104. Lot 104 ended up having a wall marking the end perpendicular to the stairs and this wall gets to another wall that is parallel to the stairs, so we kept excavating Lot 107 (403N-615E L1 0 → 10cm) to find the corner of the last wall. In Lot 106, we have a couple of vertical cut stones on the south part of the unit. These cut stones are perpendicular to the last step we have in this unit and they may be a limit to a wall, so we started excavating Lot 108 (398N-615E L1 0 → 10cm) to look for ~~at~~ the other side of this

wall. Lot 108 doesn't have any cultural features right now, so we kept excavating to Lot 109 (398N-615E L2 10 → 20cm). Lot 109 has a line that could be a wall but isn't oriented as expected (it's not symmetric to the other side). Lot 107 has the continuation of the wall but still doesn't have any corner.

2/16/95

Morning:

We started excavating Lot 110 (404N-615E L10 → 10cm) to find the corner of the wall. We kept digging Lot 111 (398N-615E L3 20 → 30cm) to see if there is really a wall ~~so we started~~. In Lot 111 it's ~~hard~~ hard to see if there is really a wall so we started excavating Lot 112 (398N-616E L3 20 → 30cm) to get a better view. In Lot 110 we exposed the continuation of the wall and still have no corner, so we kept excavating Lot 113 (405N-615E L10 → 20cm). Lot 112 had a line of cut stones that goes the same direction as lines we have in Lot 109 and 111 that may be a wall that limits the structure, but this wall isn't symmetric to the wall on the other side of the stairs. We started taking down the band of dirt we left in 400N-616E to see if there ~~is~~ are more shells. Lot 113 still had the continuation of linear rocks but it could be tumble, so we started excavating Lot 114 (405N-614E L10 → 20cm) to see what's going on because we may get the corner in this unit. We also found a piece of stamps (dancing monkeys design) in Lot 113 and a lot more bone than we are used to, probably little mammal bones. After ~~we~~ we are done with 400N-616E, we are going to dig deeper in 398N-616E to get a better view of the wall and we are going to

We kept excavating Lot 114 and Lot 48 (400N-616E). In Lot 48 there's no more shell. We started digging Lot 115 (398N-616E L4 30 → 40cm). Lot 114 is confused. We started excavating Lot 116 (401N-616E extension L1 0 → 20cm) to see how the stairs end. In Lot 115 we can't really see if there is any continuation, so we started digging Lot 117 (398N-616E L5 40 → 50cm). In Lot 117 we have the continuation of the wall. In Lot 116 we have the corner of the stairs turned in to a wall, but we need to dig deeper to have a better view of the features.

We started digging Lot 120 (402N-616E 20 → 30cm) and Lot 121 (398N-616E Extension L2 20 → 50cm). In Lot 119 and 121 we exposed the continuation of the wall. We started excavating Lot 122 (397N-616E L1 0 → 20cm) and Lot 123 (401N-616E extension L2 20 → 50cm). In Lot 120 we have a wall that is parallel to the wall we have in the other side of the stairs. We started digging Lot 124 (402N-616E L4 30 → 50cm) to follow the wall. We kept excavating Lot 125 (397N-616E L2 20 → 40cm). Lot 124 has the continuation of the wall, we started digging Lot 126 (402N-616E extension L1 0 → 20cm) to expose more

We kept excavating Lot 133 (403N-616E L2 20 \rightarrow 30 cm). In Lot 131 we have the continuation of the wall, so we started excavating the next meter Lot 134 (395N-616E L1 0 \rightarrow 20 cm). We started digging Lot 135 (403N-616E L3 30 \rightarrow 50 cm). In Lot 134 we have the continuation of the wall, but it's not really clear so we kept excavating to Lot 136 (395N-616E L2 20 \rightarrow 40 cm) to have a better view of

Yesterday morning I finished the description of my features. At lunch, I went to the new site (# 175) and set up a trench N/S on St. 9, we also cleaned the mound of brush.

Morning:

I'm going to dig on site # 470 first. So I took 6 excavators with me. I'm going to set up 2 test trenches 2x1m on the structure 2 that seems the best preserved and a test trench 2x1m on the smaller one (St. 1) for now. Those trenches are oriented N/S or E/W. We started excavating St. 1 with Lot 1 (470B, Unit 1 level 1 \rightarrow 40cm) and St. 2 with Lot 1 (470C, Unit 1 level 1 \rightarrow 40cm) and Lot 2 (Unit 3 level 1 \rightarrow 40cm). In Lot 1 of 470C, we exposed a wall oriented N/S. In Lot 1 of 470B, it's ~~not~~ really confusing, we may have a wall but I'm not sure, so we started excavating in the other unit with Lot 2 (Unit 2 level 1 \rightarrow 40cm). In Lot 3 (op 470B), we don't have any features, so we kept excavating with Lot 5 (Unit 4 level 1 \rightarrow 40cm). In Lot 6 (op 470C) we may have a wall but I'm not sure, so we kept digging Lot 8 (Unit 8 level 1 \rightarrow 20cm).
