Aprox. 8:00 AM. - arrive at site, for the next hour or so

Sites are diverged up. Staff sites - the larger of the set are assigned

The undergrad. sites are chosen by the students. My mound is 42-OP16C

It is not particularly steep, but covers a reasonably large area. I have

decided to dig a North-South Trench across my mound of 14 by

1 m. At first glance the structure appears to be slightly L-shaped, therefore

This trench will provide adequate info. Concerning the structure

Trench layout - mound 42-OP16C complete approx. 10:30 A.M.

11:00 A.M. Datum recorded mound 42-OP16C at 62 C.M. Above G.L.

Datum PT. 6 1/2 C.M. above mound surface.

Tuesday, Jan. 31 1995

Car Trouble didn't arrive until 8:00 A.M.

Rainy today. 8:15 A.M. Surface collection complete; Shards → West
side of structure only. Some art. Block

I started digging my trench in the southwestern region. Digging in
10 centimeter levels and measuring from the southwestern corner

My first square proved very successful. a reasonably large concentration
of shells were found near the surface, one chert frag. Hundreds of

shards, mostly body sherds rim & painted were found throughout.

a small figurine fragment was found in the SW corner approx. 50 cm

and at the base of the first lat a larger frag. was found 50 cm

from the SW corner.

The 2nd 10 cm. revealed about the same amount of pottery, yet larger
pieces w/ decoration, no figurine frags. No shell. Some basaltic. and

a 4 C.M. obsidian blade 64 C.M. from the S.W. corner.

additional surface reconnaissance revealed several cut stones:
 one to the east of the mound near the base of 30/9 C.M.
 one to the North and west of the base of 19/18 C.M.
 Two in associated prox. and dist. near the top of the mound
 one slightly larger stone below basal level of 20/16 C.M.
 one larger than the last on the S.W. end of mound obscured under
 surface.
 orientation of trench 18° N.

Tuesday, Feb. 1 1995

Arrived once again late - can trouble 900. Air is moist, day
 overcast. I will now attempt to dig to the sterile level, and
 determine the stratigraphy.

9:30 A.M. Completion of 3rd sub-surface lot - 10 C.M.

This lot yielded fewer large sherds than the previous 10 C.M.
~~top~~ end of apparently lesser quality. At the base of this lot
 are also the ~~first~~ first inclings of features, due to the distance
 of my current excavation unit I suspect this is evidence of only
 fallout from the top of the mound. Though the quality of the pottery
 appeared to lower, there was an increase in the amount of
 decorative features ie. sculptured handles, feet etc. Other artifacts
 include a stamp frag. whose exact provenance is unknown but
 retrieved it from the backfill (1.5 C.M. in height) approx. 25 C.M. below
 surface. Several obsidian frags. a small ^{frag.} can, covers from the
 S.W. corner 28 C.M. down. A rock apparently used for polishing.
 What appears to be an Olmeca frag. and a Tzotzil frag.
 I will now descend another 10 C.M. in this unit.

My Next ~~last~~ ^{last} did not confirm my suspicions that the Rocks were isolated Remoff from the top. The Rocks appeared to be flinty ~~placed~~ and continue to the South of the mound. I am now going to extend my trench one unit in that direction w/ the hopes of either confirming or removing my suspicions. This lot revealed only one piece of figurine (pot handle?) a few pieces of obsidian (crude) and some rough/crude pottery sherds all in lower concentrations.

I have returned from lunch at 1:30 and am digging a 15th unit behind the last.

The first Ten cm. yielded the least amount of material of any lot yet, few pieces of low quality Pottery, little frags. & 5 pieces of Obsidian approx. 1st C. M.

The Next 10 C. M. revealed more than the last, but not as much as Unit 2. No sign of Rock. Some shreds. Obsidian. Bajareque. Stone frags.

Thurs. Feb. 2 1995, Arrived at 7:30 A.M. Las Serna. Weather 3rd day of overcast. I brought the current unit (#15) down 10 more C. M. 8:30 A.M., and the results are still inconclusive. No clear sign of a feature, and very few artifacts. Small pottery frags. - low quality most unpaired. Five pieces of Obsidian, 3 flakes, 2 blades - one blade is the largest I've found yet 4/2 C. M., found 25 C. M. down, ^{to 5.6 cm} 4/11, a few pieces of Bajareque, one figurine frag. To be sure that this is not a feature of an going to proceed down to the level of unit one.

10:00 A.M. - Artifacts assemblage of the next 10 C. M. was predictable. fewer shreds than the last etc. w/ the predicted artifact assemblage came the association of rock, there is a feature between the two units, yet the actual nature is still unknown. I am now going to remove the rubble stone, and dig another 10 C. M. to the South of what I believe to be the line of this feature

My attempt at determining whether this was indeed a line of Rocks
Hence feature, proved successful. The assemblage of Shards to the south
of the rocks seem to confirm the Nature of a feature it. Artifacts
on top of the feature - No artifacts on the other side. Now I am
Investigating the top of the "feature" to determine its nature &
Size. 11:30 A.M.

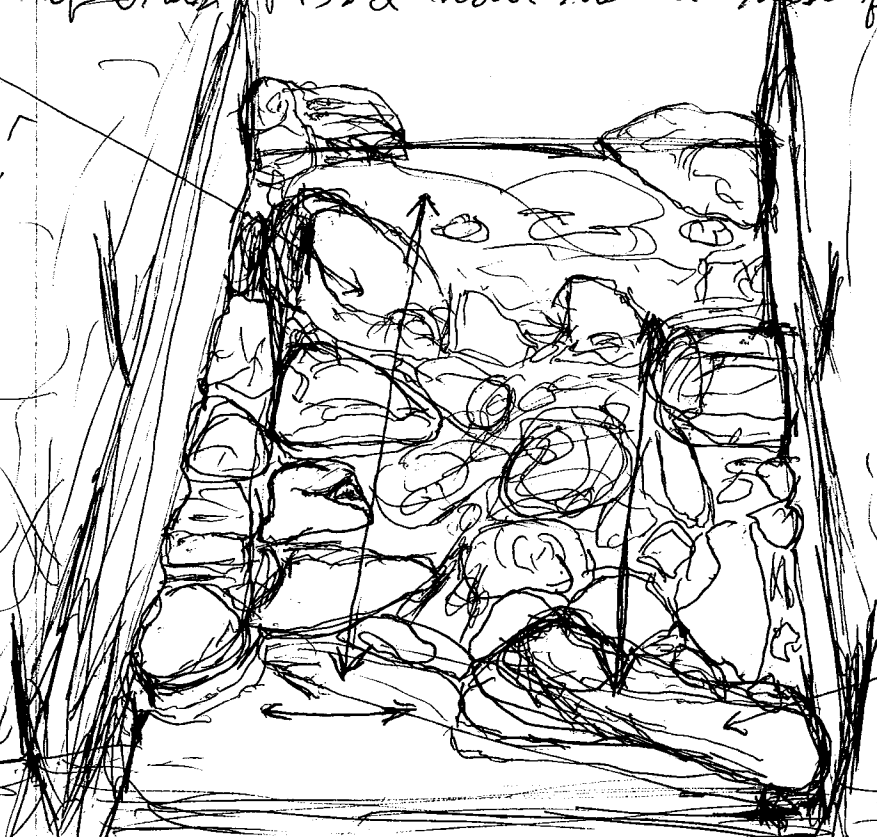
Fri, Feb. 3 1995

arrived at 7:30 A.M. weather is Sunny & warm.

My excavations yesterday revealed a stone feature of some sort
whose stone was taken from the top to show a relatively flat
surface. I am now going to continue up the trench to the north
of the mound to determine the size of this feature and continue
this excavation.

This first 100 m of Unit 2 yielded for lack of a scientific team
loopholes. To account for the paucity of artifacts I assume that
close below is another feature → possibly related to the features
of Units 1 & 15. I have named these features Sumter & Manassas.

9:30 AM. - Artifacts were less sparse this lot yet Not on par w/ the corresponding level of Unit 1 (a level which I feel was the time of heaviest occupation). My suspicions were confirmed when large Stationary rocks were uncovered in a relative line, a possible feature. Whether this is a feature and if so, if it has any Association w/ Sinter or Manassas is ~~the~~ not know at this time. I am now going to proceed another 10 C.M. in this unit while working around the 2 large Stationary rocks. I first descended 10 C.M. on the south side of the two rocks. As expected there was nothing below the 10 C.M. line except a space amount of shreds debris etc. I continued by ascending the North side of Unit 2 to find the beginning of a New Rock line behind the two adjacent before noticed. This configuration seems to form a type of open ended square over the H.E. corner stone. There is a distance of 52 C.M. between the two stones, the same approx. distance between the two rocks below in the same unit - forming what appears to be same type of steps. Further investigation revealed that the adjacent stone on the east side of Unit two was not placed there. There was a substantial amount of loose dirt underneath ~~the~~ ~~the~~ and between the bottom of the rock and the floor of the trench wherein I found a small group of shreds.

Mon. Feb. 6 1995. Arrived at La Sierra at 7:15 A.M.

The Trench is saturated w/ water making the floor a 3" mud pie. During the rains two of my stakes (possibly more) have fallen down. I will check my lines when I begin the next unit.

Now I am continuing to excavate Unit 32. Proceeding another 10 C.M.

8:40 A.M. - This past 10 C.M. has revealed only a few shreds which I believe to be run off from the top part of the structure in late occupation. There appears to be another ~~stone~~ feature

The line of rocks may or may not be parallel to Manosassa. And it is difficult to say whether it is a definite feature until the next unit is excavated. I will now break ground in Unit 3 to further the investigation of this structure.

Around 20 pieces of pottery in this level. It (the majority of Antepaste) either run off into other lower units or there is a substantial structure in the same level, dramatic soil change at 10 C.M., and what appears to be a line of rocks running from the NE. corner of Unit 3, and roughly perpendicular to Manosassa.

11:00 A.M. Digging of unit 3 continues. Until proved differently I am operating under the hypothesis that the unnamed ~~feature~~ feature is in association and perpendicular to Manosassa. Until more units are excavated I cannot be sure, I am now going to proceed to move further down to 40 C.M. in Unit 3. 12:00 break for lunch → 30-40 C.M., Unit. high % of shreds for such a small area. 5 1/2 C.M. Piece of Bone near rocks - 80 C.M. from S.W. corner. Still appears to form line perpendicular w/ Manosassa, but I am suspicious of the outer most rocks.

I have no clear take on the unnamed feature there are many, many possibilities. I have started Unit 4 and am optimistic about finding the continuation of the unnamed feature of Unit 3. 2:00 P.M. - Next unit exposed rocks of Volcanic to (Pores) found in Uniform setting apparent connection between themselves and unnamed feature in Unit 3; End of Unit 4 - 5.20 A.M. Manosassa 5.20 uncovered of a 13' (estimate) structure.

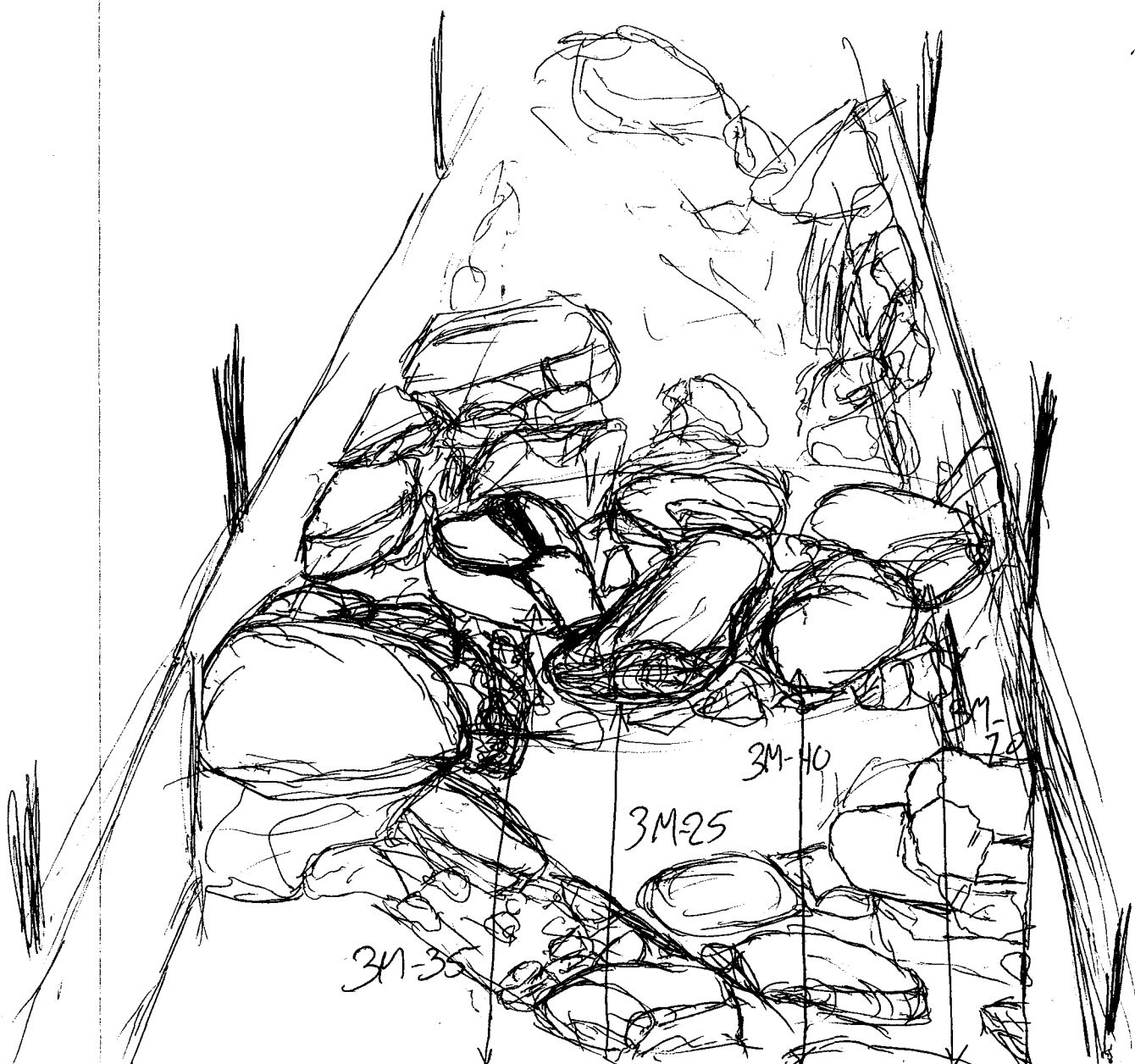
Tues Feb. 7. - arrived 7:30 A.M.

once again cool & misty. Rather than perpendicular to Manosassa the unnamed feature appears to arch at its base, and may have 3 distinct levels to it. I am going to begin excavation in Unit 5 to see how far the 3 part of the feature extends.

First 10 C.M. - Unit 5 8:30 AM.

Feature levels off in Unit 5 to 3rd Part of feature in Unit 4
I would surmise that I have reached the main part of the
Structure. Some chards found and one small piece of black lithic
A reasonably large cut black, flatly hit and in relative line
w/a group of Rocks 4 M. to the S.E. of the ~~the~~ black.
The block itself is only partially uncovered by the trench. Block is
3m from the S.W. corner of Unit 5.

all measurements Taken 15 C.M. from S.W. corner Unit 5



10:00 AM. → I decided Not to proceed into The Next Unit rather I decided to removed the loose dirt and rock from Units 3+4 to determine The Nature of The Rock Group. At this time, I can not, however it does appear to have some significance to the main structure (starting Unit 5).

Observation of Rock ^{3M} 25 from museum point - appears to have been set in place then pushed forward rather than placed on top of structure and tumbling down. It has its flat faces up and to the south, and a Rock of Unknown origin was removed to reveal very little underneath and top Rock appears to match the other. Rock ^{3M} 25 from Reference Pt. Jugs 2-4-5 C.M. (approx.) other apparent Rock.

At 11:00 A.M. - Began digging Unit 6.

The rock grouping of Unit 6 I believe to be part of a living space, yet several more units will be needed to confirm this. Only few artifacts, Shards only.

11:00 P.M. I have discontinued my ~~South~~ ^{South} attack of the trench and have decided to attack from the ~~South~~ ^{North} starting w/ Unit 14. My reasons for doing this are twofold: 1) To determine any symmetry in Architecture between the North and South ends of the structure. This will better enable ~~me~~ ^{me} to understand the confusing Rock groupings of Units 3-5. 2) The Unit 6 appearance to be the top - or near the top of the entire structure - making the probable knowledge could gain ~~from~~ ^{regard} the whole structure very little. Seeing the back and the front at the same time will also provide the proper understanding of the structure's orientation.

78 C.M. The first 10 C.M. of Unit 14 yielded several Shards, some Boreholes, and a piece of Glassy obsidian-like Rock w/ Blood Phosphates. I do not think this to be the structure's middle, but will proceed down another 10 C.M. - 2:00 P.M. 3:00 P.M. Next 10 C.M. - many Shards, Bone, obsidian. Next three lots from Units 2, 3, 4 respectively - the most debris possible living area.

Wends. Feb. 8 - 8:00 A.M. Arrived at La Siemalate due to car trouble. I now find it difficult to work in this square after following a feature of the main structure, moving from terminal debris to fill. Nevertheless it is necessary to complete this trench properly. Which means at this point attacking the structure differently. I am now proceeding another 10 C.M. in this Unit w/ the hope of finding the stink occupation level.

This level yielded many shreds much larger than the previous levels (the shreds were) and as a lot contained many more painted pieces. Some Bajazquez. 2 pieces of obsidian, one large $4\frac{1}{2}$ blade and a obsidian/chert-like lithic of a greyish color. Also at the base of this level a white round figure, probably a rock, but not telling my workers to avoid it, because I found several pieces of white pottery, on the rock may have some ceremonial importance. After digging the next ten I found the white object to indeed be a rock and out of place, it appears to be chalk. There is another large piece approx. 30 C.M. away - what these were used for I cannot know. Many large shreds almost all painted. Next level revealed a group of reasonably level flat-faced rocks - Digging in this unit will cease. Numerous pieces of painted pottery, obsidian, a stamp frog, and a drilled ceramic bead and am now going to clean the area up, free shreds, check rocks etc. 11:45 A.M.

Resumed work 1:00 P.M. more shreds at base of Unit 14 appears to be a feature, yet unable to tell unless I proceed south to Unit 13, which I am doing now.

3:00 P.M. - completed first 10 C.M. level of Unit 13. Sparse amount of shreds, most crude. A few pieces of Bajazquez. And a flat even with cretaining piece of obsidian. I am going to proceed another 10 C.M. in this Unit to attempt to find a connection between the rocks of Unit 14 and the main structure.

The next 10 c.m. yielded about as many shreds as the last some Bajonegus and one small piece of obsidian. Some Rocks made themselves known this level in the Southeast Corner of Unit 13. They form a kind of Group but it is not known whether this is part of the general structure, or tumble from the top of the structure.

I will go down another 10 c.m. tomorrow w/ the intention of discovering or uncovering a connection between these and the group of Rocks in Unit 14.

Mon. Feb. 9. arrived at 8:00 A.M., weather is fair. I began by looking up some shreds I discovered in the N.E. Corner of Unit 14. There was an extremely high concentration of large shreds underneath some largest Rocks. Also found were a few large pieces of Bajonegus, an obsidian blade & a large Staphyrodont w/ its handle partially intact. I am now excavating the next ten c.m. of Unit 13.

This level revealed many large shreds as the ones before & three ~~fine~~ fine pieces of obsidian. In the South of Unit 13 are a group of Rocks - Some Tumbled/ apparently sturdy ones my next level should discern their nature and possible connection to the Rocks of Unit 14.

10:00 A.M. → more Rocks, all as old & would suspect to be tumbled many large shreds which were apparently smashed by this tumbled and now going down to the level even up Unit 14.

Next level even greater assemblage of shreds. This may be in part due to the manner in which it was excavated. After the large shed numerous ~~as~~ I found in the previous levels I ascended slowly using only the trowel and consider the recovery a success though it is hard to tell what may have happened had I used a pick and shovel. I am now on level w/ Unit 14 and am currently removing loose rocks and dirt from the floor of the Trench.

12:30 P.M. resumed excavation cleaning up loose rock and dirt. There does appear to be a floor here - of sort. accounting for the large amounts of sherds. The tumble would then have crushed the pots on the floor. This is all very clean w/ the Rock-Sherd-Rock stratigraphy. I have noted this floor Antetum.

I have sent my workers to Unit 7 to begin excavating the top of the mound. I will then expose the sherds in Unit 13.

Along w/ the usual sherds & obsidian I also found a piece of bone.

Lot 35 contains the few sherds from the top of the structure. Nothing out of the ordinary gone rock groupings, possible limestone. They will continue north into Unit 8.

3:00 P.M. My workers have reached what I believe to be the top of the structure,

removed sherds from ground & rocks on floor of the trench (Antetum did not touch sherds along walls of trench on Tumble in the South of Unit 13).

Friday Feb. 10 1975. Arrived at La Sierra - 7:30 A.M.

Saw Page, which will probably turn off at an going to continue what I started at the end of yesterday - clearing the Tumble Rock away from the living surface of Antetum. While my workers will continue clearing the top of the mound.

8:30 A.M. workers finish top of mound, now moving open the other side and are two units away from where I am working. As now Antetum on top saw a handful of sherds.

The next unit yielded a few creek sherds, & 1 Obsidian Core Rocks appear more uniform in that unit than in previous.

10:00 AM. I am one unit away from the completion of my trench.

11:30 P.M. To have completed as much as I can w/ Antetum
 Primarily all the large shreds were wedged in between the Rocks
 which presumably fell off the Top of the Structure. This Notion
 of the Pots lying between an Antetum then crushed by the Structure
 Tumble was confirmed by a very substantial piece possibly $\frac{1}{2}$
 of a Pot in between Antetum and another Rock. This piece
 is ~~approx.~~ 92 C.M. below surface and most of the Pot lies to
 the West last of Unit 14. For this reason I am leaving it until
 it can be properly exposed. All of the Rocks in Unit 13 appear
 to be Tumble. Antetum is 50 C.M. below the surface. My
 lots are twofold. The First are shreds from the rocks 20-30
 C.M. below surface. The second includes two ^{large} potsherds
 found 40-50 C.M. below surface, having saved as much pottery
 as I can from the Tumble. I will now excavate Unit 12 to
 complete my trench.

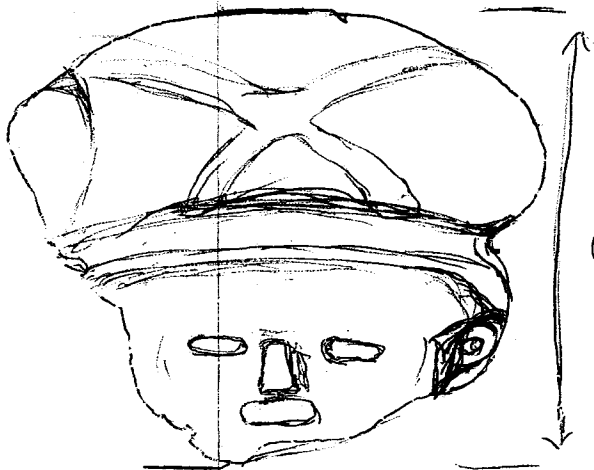
Mon. Feb. 13 - Arrived at La Sierra 7:30 A.M.

even though I wanted very hard last week I am upset & did
 not finish my trench. I am a small lot away from this
 task.

8:15 A.M. - Trench completed. There is a greater definition
 of ^{of} line in this end of the Structure, however I am not
 going to use this as a model for the south end. I am now
 going to investigate the extent of Antetum. I am going to clear
 the group of Rocks in Unit (4 to 1) get a better understanding
 of the Staircase (2) and hopefully an understanding of Antetum's
 nature, its purpose beginning & end.

9:30 A.M. - finished removing Rocks from Unit 14. afterwards
 I leveled the soil below the Rock group to 60 C.M. large
 amount of artefacts - numerous shreds, of the same type
 as the rest of Antetum. Some obsidian & two ceramic
 figurines - both human; one large one small. May have been
 ancestral portraits, Motive figures, part of larger piece etc.

Their exact Nature I am not sure about. Antetum most definitely extends into Unit 14, how far below the present surface is not yet known. I will now try to determine this by descending to a sterile level (another 10 C.M.)



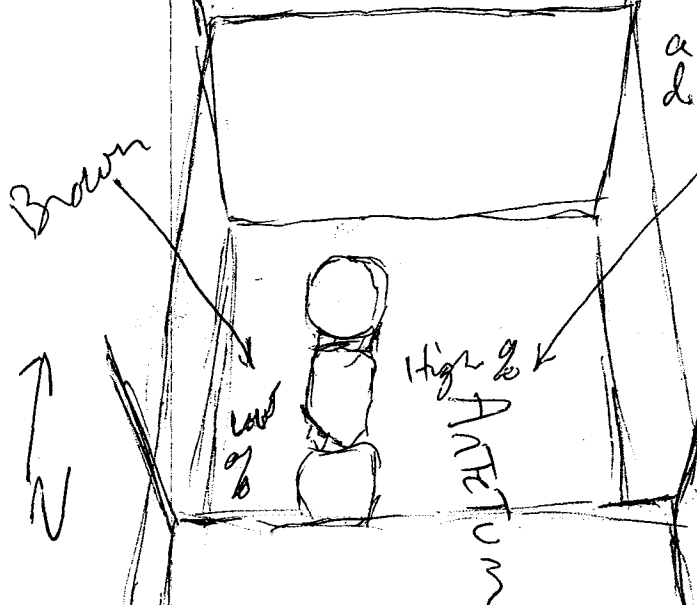
I have taken this Unit down to 10 C.M. - my deepest probe yet. I feel it is safe to say that Antetum was a midden of 6 C.M. sorts during the structures occupation. The material yielded was not only great in number and artifact size, but in variety as well. The dead assemblage was found to be a living surface. In addition

to these shreds I also found an accretion frag. of a bird. A fig. frag. in two pieces and quite large. A chert (what I think is) core and some obsidian. There is still a substantial amount of material for this Unit so I will take it down another 10 C.M.

As I began the next 10 C.M. I saw a small line of three rocks in this Unit. I thought nothing of it until there appeared a great disparity between the

The Number of artifacts to the East of the line and to the west. I further noticed a fairly dramatic change in soil colour. The soil to the east of the line being a lighter greyish stock and to the west a darker brown.

I have decided NOT to continue down at this Unit but rather move to Unit 13. I have noticed a change in soil hardness & colour. Lower artifacts - only shreds / Bajonque

Arrived La Sierra 7:30 A.M. Feb. 14 - Valentine's day
 Yesterday I mistook some hard dirt for an Earthen floor in Unit 13. I see that for that to have been a floor is either impossible or it already went Ten C.M. below it in Unit 14. Either way I feel it is more important to be uniform and do not feel now that it is a floor. The sun was strong yesterday and I feel I may have made some hasty conclusions.

10:00 A.M. This lot taken from Tumble - So. Unit 13 / No. Unit 12
 many shreds small & crumb mostly - no clear sign of a structure feature - many many fallen Rocks. Obsidian - core, Basaltic & large pieces. Stay frag.
 No Success in finding a feature. The removal of Rocks in Unit 13 revealed only a large amount of dirt and shreds & brought Unit 13 down to an even level 10 C.M. above Unit 14
 Found a ceramic bead. Currently 11:30 A.M. doing the same for Unit 12.

1:45 P.M. Unit 12 is now 70 C.M. Deep (Unit 13 - 80 C.M.)
 Numerous shreds found in last lot, some obsidian. and what appears to be a ceramic w/a Human figure. A feature may be apparent in this unit, as I have uncovered what seems to be a line of stationary Rocks I am not going to dig any further in Units 13 & 14 on the floor of 12, but rather devote my efforts to probing the ~~large~~ ^{rock} groupings for features.

Feb. 15 - Wed. My previous investigation yesterday has revealed a line of rock which I believe to be the basal line of the Structure. I will now investigate this line to see how much of it is preserved. The line of Rock is in fact well-preserved and extends across of fairly uniform large flat Rock similar to Mazonia. I have named this feature Fredricksburg and will refer to the feature of Unit 12 as even ~~the~~ only shreds found. There appears to be a feature 46 C.M. So. of Fredricksburg. The line of Rocks is difficult to see as well

The Rocks which form a line have slumped down - I believe from age and the weight of the fall from the top of the structure. Javel investigation revealed few shreds.

11:15 A.M. I have not reported much this morning for lack of News. I have been following the feature ~~to~~ along Fredricksburg South, and have named it Vicksburg. Saw Sheds and two small pieces of Obsidian this lot. It is extremely confusing for the Tumble is quite dense and solid. The best course of action I feel would be to follow Fredricksburg to the East.

This is exactly what I shall do. I shall construct 1 M/1 m Unit - 30 C.M. distance from Unit 12, w/ the intention of picking up Fredricksburg also. I have given a Name to the line of Rocks in Unit 14 for reference only will be Pea Ridge.

My notes may be dry for here to whenever - This morning I started feeling ill. Currently - 1:30 P.M. I have been getting cramps like shooting pains in my stomach, lightness and tired. I am not going to personally dig small holes and on coast of Malady is known.

0-10 C.M. Unit 16 very few shreds - one Rock just below the Surface - presumably Tumble.

As suspected the Rock was Tumble, and underneath it was only dirt and Sheds. There is still some operative Rock but I would imagine nothing permanent until it joins Fredricksburg 2/16/95 - Thurs. Feb. I appear to have recovered from whatever Malady I was afflicted w/ yesterday. I am continuing my Pursuit of the eastern side of Fredricksburg. I will take this unit down to 50 C.M. Fredricksburg's distance Below Surface. Rather than the usual 10 C.M. I descended twenty this lot most was Rock. I figured it was rare to go down an even twenty than go dry. I will proceed another ten hopefully getting my Foreman. I decided to break the next lot at 48 C.M. in order to get a better take on the Rocks. I have asked

my workers to excavate only 2/3 of the Unit this lot w/ the hopes that Fredricksburg is behind the line & instructed and I will be able to see its profile.

10:30 A.M. found a large amount of Shards this lot. From this I suspect I am close to Antietam. I am keeping the same line of excavation for this lot - for I believe I may have picked up Fredricksburg in the past level. I hope to see it more clearly in another 10 C.M. It is going to be impossible to detect the continuation of this feature for sure w/out extending the unit ~~South~~ ^{South} ..

11:15 A.M. about the same Volume of Shards No obsidian mostly repaired. Feature still hidden due to amount of fall on the top of it.

There does appear to be a line of Rock corresponding to Fredricksburg in Unit 16. This line, however is not so definite that it is worth pursuing to the East. I have decided to move south into another Unit named Unit 17. There also may exist the possibility of a curved local line - meaning Fredricksburg would not extend straight out to the East but rather would curve into Unit 17. Either way I should be able to determine Fredricksburg's feature from this Unit. As well I should first encounter the eastern end of Vicksburg first at approx. 25 C.M.

No sign of Vicksburg this lot 61 - Very sparse Artifacts lot 62 composed of Shards from the ~~top~~ South wall of Unit 16.

Fri, Feb. 17 - Arrived at 7:45. Weather is Pleasant. Currently digging Unit 17. Possible Traces of Vicksburg. 8:30 A.M. First Ten C.M. of the day revealed some Shards & Byzantine concerning ~~with~~ the rock grouping is Vicksburg or not ~~to~~ from the measurements of rock depth, orientation etc. I cannot positively conclude that the Rocks in Unit 17 are part of Vicksburg. There is no clear uniformity to these Rocks (Unit 17) but I could not understand why a feature would end where it does.

11:00 - lot 71 Cares from Unit 8 and Contains Shards obsidian & Bayaneguc. The Rock grouping So. of Severnary Bridge is indeed a feature which I have named The Peach Orchard.

11:15 - The first 10 C.M. of Unit 18 has been dug. lot 72 - same Shards, a large lithic, and some Bayaneguc. Some Rock is present Presumably Tumble, I do not expect to see architecture until around 40-50 C.M.

2:00 P.M. - lot 73 Contains several Shards from 10-20 C.M. Unit 18. Some large flat Rocks were found in this unit of approx. line ^{as} of Fredricksburg but of separate levels. I am not proceeding any further in the So. end of Unit 18, and excavating only on the North end of the Rock grouping.

Meanwhile to the So. the Peach Orchard is being cleared of 'Joco' Rocks and loose dirt, I have no idea what this is about of ne them. There should be a line, but all the Rocks are angled, sloped or fallen.

2:30 P.M. Peach Orchard ^{lot 74} yielded several Shards, Obsidian, Bayaneguc and a Metate Frag. (lgy.) approx. 9/15 C.M. Work will continue there tomorrow as will Unit 18's excavation. lot 75 - Unit 18 yields only Shards and I feel will discern the Nature of the Rock Grouping in Unit 18.

Tues - Feb. 21 - arrived at Site 7:30 A.M. - digging continues as usual in 18 + in cleaning loose dirt and Rock from the Southern part of the trench. I am following one feature in the North while probing the South for another.

9:00 A.M. lot 76 30-40 C.M. Unit 18. Many Shards in front of Rock grouping most painted - large Shards. & Some Bayaneguc & a 5 1/2 C.M. Obsidian blade, I am now proceeding 20 C.M. in the approx. S.W. corner of Unit 18 This is an area poor in Rocks and may give me a better idea of this Group's Nature.

7:30 A.M.

Feb. 22 - Weds. Yesterday was cut short by a sudden and strong rain storm. I reached lot 79 ~~Yesterday~~, 75-78 all containing obsidian. Lot 79 is a solitary lot composed of bone found found around 11:00 A.M. - Feb. 21 in Unit 3. I have no reason to believe that it is human bone or of a burial of some kind, but there is a substantial amount of the material. I am now investigating the bone in Unit 3, while my water work in Unit 18 and removing rock from the main trench.

8:15 There does not appear to be much more bone in Unit 3. I have bagged what I found and closing the lot up. Lot 80 comes from Unit 9 and contains some shells and two pieces of obsidian.

Lat 81 of Unit 18 - has exposed a very large rim which I have chosen not to remove for the time being. Bone shells a small piece of obsidian and one piece of Bayaegue.

9:15 - I've just finished removing the large rim in Unit 18.

It is quite large - so big I believe it to be complete. The volume of shells and type of artefacts found in Unit 18 are comparable to those found on Antietam - yet the levels of measurement do not coincide, for my next trick is going to move into the Unit sec. of 18 which should correspond w/ Vickburg. This should answer my question of whether the Rocks and Artefacts in Unit 18 are indeed associated w/ E. Antietam.

10:00 I appear to have found the beginning of the Main Structure on the South ~~the~~ end of the trench in Unit 4. As always it is badly preserved, but seems to have a more/less line and is a good place to have a step up to the main structure.

Lot 82 - Unit 18 - contains the large rim, several other painted large shells & some Bayaegue. → 60 C.A.

I am now going to open another 1/1 m unit (19) to the So. of 18.

Lat 83 - Units 3+4, Terminal Debris, contained the usual
shards, obsidian, Bajonegus. There is still no clear feature
along the south side.

The investigation is difficult - especially in the South. For there are
hardly any ridges of fire. I am using a broken yet placed
cut block as a sort of guide - I figure that there must be
something around that block.

Thurs. Feb. 23. arrived - 7:30 overcast. Since we have
been digging I believe to have found the continuation of
Vicksburg in Unit 19 - it is 30 c.m. below surface, ~~placed~~

line as Vicksburg. No clear sign of Fredricksburg - though it should
reveal itself. In the South a line of Rocks going south from the

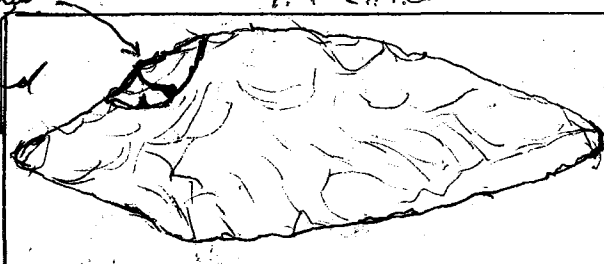

Description of features and final observation on Structure 46-16C/N/2.

Basal line North: Fredricksburg - measured from Datum bottom 104 to 83 C.M. Top. IT runs East West at 218° through 3 units 16, 12 & 18 and is preserved best in unit 12, 77 C.M. from ^{East} wall of unit 16, 52 C.M. from its North, and continues until unit 18 where it turns in slightly to ~~be~~ 83 C.M. from that unit's N. wall and ends almost precisely at unit 4's East boundary. One cut block used Rocks in unit 12 rather large unit 18 fairly small.

Basal line North: Vicksburg - through Fredricksburg ~~is~~ the Northernmost line I feel it does not continue far enough to be the actual North basal line what I would consider this designation for is Vicksburg. Sharing the 83 C.M. B. Datum - as the top of Fredricksburg and 47 C.M. Below datum at its top. Same westing as Fredricksburg. IT runs from unit 16, where a large block protrudes from the east wall of that unit to 76 C.M. from the west wall of unit 8. Rocks are fairly uniform in size and placement reasonably well preserved however several rocks in unit 12 have slipped down from their original position.

Basal line West 1: Glorietta Pass - which runs from the corner of Vicksburg in unit 8 to unit 11 4 units away - 2 M/55 C.M. in length. Height 86 C.M. Base below Datum 67 C.M. Top below Datum. Though the line is still apparent in unit 9 it depressed to a depth of 97 C.M. Below Datum. Orientation 5° North. Rocks are large and uniform.

Basal line West 2: Keresaw Mountain - which continues the line started by Glorietta Pass. It would be all one line had Keresaw Mountain not shelved 27 C.M. to the west of Glorietta pass before beginning. Further runs south for 1.78 M. descending from 37 C.M. B.D. to 84 C.M. B.D. The line is quite sparse in places but contains a few large River cobbles and cut blocks. There is a 69 C.M. gap between it and the south wall of unit 26.5 + 52 C.M. from the west wall of unit 26. + 54 C.M. from the west wall of unit 11. It is 35 C.M. in its highest pt. + 52 C.M. at its widest pt. Orientation: true North

South Basal wall 1: Cold Harbor - The Southernmost line of the main structure begins at the corner of Keresaw Mt. and runs east from Unit 26 16N to Unit 4 16C of the main trench. Total length 2.76 M. 43 C.M. wide. Top of feature 79 - C.M. BD. Bottom of feature 104 C.M. BD. Orientation: due east.

The line itself is very apparent, yet many rocks are tilted out of place all river cobbles. through its orientation is due east. The angle where the two features meet is very badly preserved.

South Basal line 2: Atlanta - begins 37 C.M. North of Cold Harbor's edge and runs east for ~~3~~ 65 M. it is at an odd angle. The rocks are small and low and badly preserved on a whole. The line slopes to the S.E. from 92 C.M. BD. to 100 C.M. BD. 15 C.M. wide. And in most parts only one small cobble in height.

Orientation 81° . due to its lack of preservation compared to the features around it I would say Atlanta was basal in the sense that it was connecting two separate lines. This, the height & size of the rocks leads me to think that this was the Southern entrance to the structure.

South Basal line 3: New Market - starts a new line continuing Atlanta. Starting in Unit 10 16Q up a almost square cut block and moving East for 2.85 M. to Unit 5 16Q. IT continues along from Unit 10 for 1.80 M. Then drops off and continues at 1.80 M. as a rectangular cut block where from a line of apparently non-contiguous construction was added to it (I will add this in later.) The cut block is 66 C.M. East Basal line: The Wilderness - The largest & best preserved of any of my walls. Made from large, flat uniform River cobbles. It begins in Unit 5 ^{16Q} at the corner of New Market to the North wall of Unit 5 16N. IT presumably continues North and meets Vicksburg in one of the uncovered areas. The line itself runs almost parallel to the the Eastern & Western walls of the trench. Though the wall is

it is taller in the North than at its southern corner. The line runs nearly on the border of units 3 & 5 16 N. The wilderness is 5.86 M in visible length & I estimate that it continues for 2 more before reaching Vicksburg. On the South before it turns a corner the wilderness is 83 C.M. Below D. (top) + 111 C.M. B.D. (Base), 36 C.M. wide in North 78 C.M. B.D. (top) + 128 C.M. B.D. (Base). Orientation 70° . I would give the width of the wilderness in the North but there is another feature above and to the west of it.

Summit feature East: The Angle - lies above and to the west of the wilderness. Visible length is 88 C.M. getting for unit 3. I would estimate it continues at least 1 M North - possibly two and has some connection to Vicksburg. It is 75 C.M. wide - presumably a well/road division. Its eastern base is 45 C.M. B.D. its eastern base is 71 C.M. B.D. To Top of the Angle is 35 C.M. B.D. 45 C.M. B.D. is the approx. level of the summit floor.

Summit Feature East: Cemetery Hill - begins in unit 3 16 N and turns Southward (West) through units 1 & 12 16 Q it connects w/ the angle to form a corner. Visibly extends for ≈ 1.6 M & probably for another M. 56 C.M. wide, Top 26 C.M. B.D. - Base No. side same as Angle's Base S.E. Side 66 B.D. Orientation: 245° . In General the line is apparent, yet poorly preserved.

Summit Feature East/West: Seminary Ridge - lies to the N.W. of Cemetery Hill + 101 C.M. West of The Angle. & ~~the~~ 2.36 M from Vicksburg to the South. It is 5.08 M in length, varies considerably in width. It shows south in unit 23 yet is fairly well preserved except in unit 13 16 N where it is barely visible. Orientation: 270° . East/West. Top is 13 C.M. B.D. Base is 39 C.M. B.D. in the East.

Summit Feature West: The Wheatfield - forms a cross w/ Seminary Ridge 1.1 M from Seminary Ridge $\frac{1}{2}$ mark. 2.68 M. in length 1.17 M from Vicksburg. 48 inches wide. Top 10 C.M. B.D. Orientation 15° . 1 cut Block at base on North side of Seminary Ridge.

Summit feature East/West - Little Round Top - Runs perpendicular to The Wheatfield. Intersects w/ wheatfield at 1 M 15 at the west side of its length. 56 C.M. wide. 3.75 M. in visible length continues east presumably for at least 1 M may connect to ~~the angle~~ ^{anetary hill} and may turn a corner North to connect to Serenay Ridge. TOP 23 C.M. B.D. Base 58 C.M. B.D. Orientation 99°. Section in main trench well-placed. The rest fairly poor.

Summit feature west: Peach orchard - runs perpendicular to Serenay ridge forms one (west) side of main trench 2.85 in total length. 46 C.M. in width. Descends from 2 C.M. B.D. in the North to 23 C.M. B.D. in South. 15° orientation. runs parallel to Wheatfield, East side of wheatfield, west side of Peach orchard, North side of Little Round Top, south side of Serenay Ridge forms a square.

B.D. may have been a connection between Shiloh & Devil's Den. orientation Dec West. Join Keresaw Mt. in west

Lower main basal wall 2: Chancellorsville - lies east of Keresaw Mt. Roughly equidistant between Shiloh and Cold Harbor, function unknown. 30 C.M. wide. Runs into main trench roughly connects to Atlantic. length 2.73 75 C.M. D.B. Orientation 285°

Off Structure feature 1: Manassas - North end 1m from Cold Harbor found in units 15 + 1. the width 1.07 M. length indeterminate - spans the width of the trench. 111 C.M. B.D. 300° - Orientation.

Off-structure feature 2: Seven pines - runs south from the west end of New market - 28 C.M. The S.W. of N. Market and Seven pines being a square cut block. From there it runs 1.19 M south into unexcavated Territory of suspect it proceeds for about 30 C.M..

65 C.M. from main trench. 18° orientation

Off Structure feature 3: appomattox - runs roughly parallel to Seven pines. full length visible - 172 C.M. runs south from a rectangular cut block in New Market. one cut block present in appomattox. 94 C.M. between west side of it and east side of seven pines. 48 C.M. wide. Orientation 130° .

Off-structure feature 4: Spottsylvania - forms the south line of a rough square from it North ~~to~~ Seven pines, east New market and South Appomattox. Arrived in the site core of La Sierra today at approx. 8:00 A.M. unloading an 8-week excavation of structure LA-18. A 'blind' structure separating the thought of ritual center from the residential center. This structure lies north of the Ball Court and is the closest structure on the north side to the Ball Court. Due to this, the shape/size of the building, outward assemblage of cut block, proximity to buildings and areas where cobbles of ritual items were found orientation to the East I believe that this structure held some religious importance. My objective for the next 8 weeks is to determine the exact (As I can) nature & function of this structure. If it does as I suspect have some ritual/ceremonial importance what is the extent of it? What does its proximity in the site core tell us about building placement? What can be inferred from as to the function of architecture in a religious context?

The structure is approx. 30 M long, 15 M. wide w/ a summit surface of approx. 20 M. it's very difficult to tell but I estimate the building's height at 4 M. To begin w/d have constructed an axial trench oriented at 95° East/West of 25 M in length. I will open either end simultaneously in an attempt to expose the east and west faces of the building.

Lot 1 - Surface collection; Shards, shell & lithic.

The surface collection yielded in particular a large partially worked playfish chert core.

There were several looter holes along the sides & surface of the structure. Some were recent.

I am having each team go 40 C.M. B.S. of after the initial yielded or little.

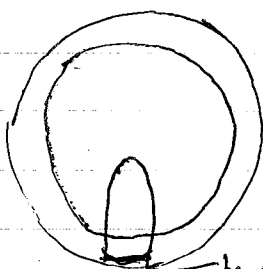
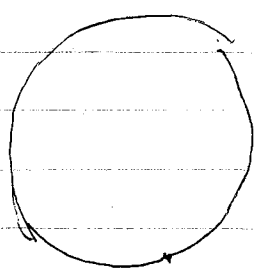

Description of Features:

Secret Shaven - feature in 28D beginning in unit 9 made almost entirely of cut block, originally two courses high. What I suspect to be the case is a good deal of these blocks were robbed in Antiquity. Total length - 8.4 m. Possibly longer, I suspect that due to a) the robbing b) the large amount of fill (cobble) in which this structure was buried under c) its close proximity to Structure where inner wall fall had pounded to Southern end of the line; that this line continued to Structure also. Pieces of cut block, schist slabs and materials used in building Secret Shaven were found in the area south of the line. Base on North end 1.08 m below datum - top at N is 88 c.m. B.D. - at lowest pt. base is 1.31 m B.D. and top is 1.15 m B.D. in an area where blocks are 2 courses high top was 91 c.m. base 1.20 m. B.D. width is a fairly uniform 40 c.m. where in the ~~west~~ west it runs into Moby dick. 8° E of N. Moby dick similar construction originally 2 courses high. Only 2.4 m of line remain all was packed w/ dense fill. Base of wall same as top Secret Shaven North. top 66 c.m. B.D. same orientation, 38 c.m. wide where it runs into -

The boat that wouldn't float - Very little left of this line only 3 face stones remain 1.4 m in length. Base B.D. same as Moby's top top - 51 c.m. B.D. Orientation same. width is indeterminate due to the quantity of missing blocks and the amount of fill. I believe that this last step was a platform which at a relatively level surface connected this feature and 2 yrs. before the mast.
