SMALL FACE FRAGMENT, QUITE ERODED. EYES, SIMPLY MADE WITH SHORT INCISIONS, .7cm LONG, ARE PRESENT. THE NOSE, 1.4cm LONG x 1cm WIDE, IS ERODED. NO NOSTRILS ARE VISIBLE. THE MOUTH, POSSIBLY EXCISED, IS 1.1cm LONG x .4cm TALL. ONE POSSIBLE TOOTH COULD BE ARGUED FOR, BUT IT MAY ALSO JUST BE A MANUFACTURING MISTAKE. IN GENERAL THE PIECE IS BADLY ERODED. HEAD WOULD HAVE BEEN HOLLOW.
