This fragment ~~seems to be~~ is a part of a figurine that is difficult to ~~not~~ identify for certain. It is rounded overall, but has two finger sized push marks on one side, almost eyebrow-shaped, but the hollows under them are broken off, making it difficult to say for sure. Also, the fragment is rather irregularly shaped to be a forehead. This was probably part of a hollow figurine, when complete.
