A solid, 3-dimensional figurine. Probably once an animal like a dog. The head + one leg have broken off, and the bottoms of the legs are severely eroded. This looks to have been made of a tube of clay with more tubes attached for legs + head. The tail, as preserved, is only a bump - but it may have been eroded down. No other detailing is evident, due to erosion.

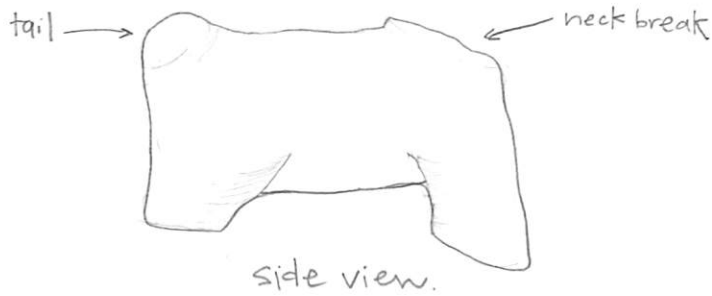
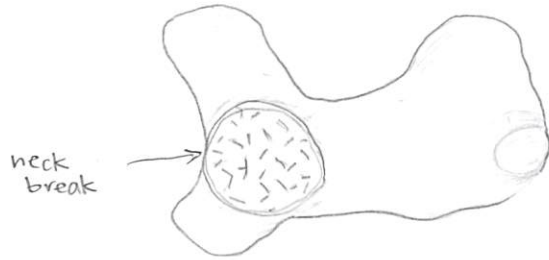
The item is: not eroded - slightly - moderately - very - extremely eroded.
