FRAGMENT OF A HEADDRESS, POSSIBLY NAPOLEON HAT-ESQUE. RIGHT SIDE FRAG. HEADDRESS BASE IS INCISED (8 PRESERVED) ON AVG. .5cm LONG x .2cm THICK AND .1cm APART. THESE APPEAR NOT TO BE MOLD-MADE AND OTHER SHALLOW INDENTATIONS AND TOOL SCRATCHES ARE VISIBLE ON THE INTERIOR AND EXTERIOR. FIGURINE HEAD WOULD HAVE BEEN HOLLOW WHEN COMPLETE.
