Additional descriptive comments on figurative or decorative portion of the exterior:

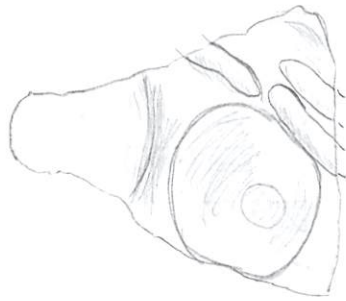
This portion of a ~~hollow~~ figurine seems to represent a breast and part of a necklace. It is possible that it is actually a nose + mouth, but the eyes are not where they should be, and the form is more round + flat than the noses on most figurines. It seems to have red slip (Munsell: 5YR 4/6) over all of it. The paste is bright orange, as if it had been re-fired (Munsell: 5YR 6/8).

The item is: not eroded - slightly - moderately - very - extremely eroded.
