Additional descriptive comments on figurative or decorative portion of the exterior:

A portion of the nose + mouth of a human figurine. The nose is large + triangular, and either has extremely large + protruding nostrils, or more likely a noseplug that goes through both sides. However, the artifact is extremely eroded, so this is somewhat difficult to determine. The mouth is open, and probably once had teeth, but again, they cannot be seen definitively. The outside has turned a bright orange (Mursell: 5YR 6/8), probably from re-firing, while the inside is a more normal light brown - (7.5YR 6/4).

The item is: not eroded - slightly - moderately - very extremely eroded.
