Firing core: no  
Stratification: Horizontal, both sides; (Faint vertical stratification) over  
exterior  
Clay: AS thick AS 0.9cm, over the top to the top of the neck (2cm)  
tip, thinning slightly on the neck; interior: thinner, 2.4cm  
back from the basal lip; both sides have continuous clay deposits  
neck: 3.6cm high, consistent, 1.1cm lip (0.6cm across)  
Base: 6cm across, and outflaring, "2" lip
