Comments:

Fragment has a lot of dried / baked clay on the entire exterior surface; probably several episodes of use / baking. Vessel created to be a potstand b/c bottom is finished & has a shallow flair allowing for a sturdy base. Interior not smoothed. Probably not fired multiple times b/c not very pinkish like other deeply refired / baked stands.
