Clay from making other vessels is baked on the ~~exterior~~ - interior - both sides - neither side

How many layers of clay are there? 1 - more than one (give the number): 2

The piece is: slightly - moderately - very - extremely - eroded / is not eroded.

Comments: A brief section of the bottom edge is chipped such that the fragment will balance flat w/ pressure. The upper rim exposes ~ 3cm of a break extending far ~ 2cm. There are globular bits of clay covering most of the exterior w/ a thin globular layer w/ some globules being more than one course high. The interior is just around the chipped portion of the lower rim.
