NOTE: this catalog sheet is *not* to be used for sherds that were deliberately shaped; this is for *opportunistically used* items only!

The shape of this object is approximately: triangular – square – rectangular – oval – tear-drop – other (describe): *parallelogram*

The margin/edge was chipped to form the item. (y) n

The margin/edge was deliberately ground to smooth it: (y) n

The margin/edge is smoothed from use: (y) n → *one side*

There is other use wear visible: (y) n

Trace the item on the reverse, both frontal view and profile, and show where there is use.

Describe the use:

The edge between top of sherd & bottom is rounded with an area more worn down b/c it has worked the glass/burnish away.

The type-variety from which this was made is: MAN

Comments:

2 of the edges appear to have little to none reworking on them. The other two edges appear very straight. also looking @ it @ an angle, one edge appears larger than the other. For example, the end with the use wear is thinner than the opposite side
