

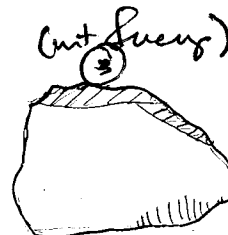
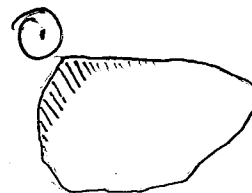
Describe the use: ① gentle sloping smoothed rounding that has altogether worn away the edge

② this small portion of the interior edge is differentially worn to the rest of the side, as well as a rounding of the margin (cut facing)
