VERBAL DESCRIPTION: This worked sherd is intact: y-(n)

If no, approximately what percentage is preserved (give a number): 85-90

The shape of this object is approximately: triangular - square - rectangular - oval - tear-drop - other (describe): Diamond. Tip has been clipped to view profile. Opposite end was not worked smooth, only generally clipped

A scribed/lightly incised line demarcating the circumference is visible: y-(n)

The margin/edge was chipped to form the item: y-(n)

The margin/edge was deliberately ground to smooth it: ~~y-(n)~~ yes

The margin/edge is smoothed from use: y-(n) (probably from fingers)

There is other use wear visible: y-(n)

Trace the item on the reverse, both frontal view and profile, and show where there is use.

Describe the use:

Not known b/c the tip was chipped. The narrowing indicates there was a point, which probably displayed how it was used.

The type-variety from which this was made is: PN

Comments: No physical differences between interior and exterior curvature. The clipped side, judging from the overall shape, may have been the original in a roughly constructed diamonds. The two narrowing branches are smoothed nicely; however b/c they are bent in, they may be finger marks for a point. OR they could have been used to work round surfaces
