The shape of this object is approximately: triangular - square - rectangular - oval - tear-drop - other (describe): Approx diamond, ~~unlike~~ ~~the~~ ~~last~~ ~~one~~ looking Snow Cone.

A scribed/lightly incised line demarcating the circumference is visible: y - n

The margin/edge was chipped to form the item: y - n

Comments: The ① < ② point is overlapping (~.1cm) such that it may have been used. Although the continuity of the erosion on the ~~exterior~~ ③ leads me to believe this is the whole thing.
