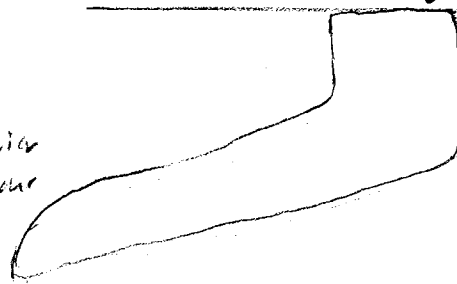

Comments: Very eroded, but ground edge is clear. The lower lip is very irregular and poorly finished, and the exterior is wavy, with the indentations looking like finger marks
